January Action Items:

- 2017 Officers. Elected Jeff Barnes, City of Nampa, as Chair and Brian McClure, City of Meridian, as Vice Chair.
- TMA Balancing Action. Approved an action to "balance" the Surface Transportation Program Transportation Management Area (STP-TMA) program. This action took funding that had been released last fall, due to a bid coming in less than estimated, and applying that funding to existing projects where actual costs were higher than originally estimated. The three projects that will receive funding are a COMPASS freight study, intersection improvements at State Highway 16 and Beacon Light Road, and pedestrian improvements in the City of Kuna.
- Resource Development Plan. Recommended COMPASS Board approval of the DRAFT 2017 COMPASS Resource Development Plan.
