Boise City Councilmember Elaine Clegg Elected President of National Metropolitan Planning Organization

Meridian, ID – The Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho (COMPASS) is pleased to announce that Boise City Councilmember Elaine Clegg has been elected as 2016 President of the Board of Directors of the Association of Metropolitan Planning Organizations (AMPO). Councilmember Clegg has represented COMPASS on the AMPO Board of Directors since 2010; she sits on the COMPASS Board as a representative of the City of Boise.

AMPO is a national, membership-based organization representing metropolitan planning organizations from around the country.
