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RTAC AGENDA ITEM III-B Date: January 22, 2025

Topic: FY2025 Statewide Safety Performance Targets

Request/Recommendation:

COMPASS staff seeks RTAC recommendation of COMPASS Board of Directors' adoption of the Idaho Transportation Department (ITD's) FY2025 statewide safety performance targets for fatality and serious injury rates and of regional targets for number of fatalities, serious injuries, and non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries.

Background/Summary:

Transportation Performance Management (TPM) is a strategic data-driven framework developed by the Federal Highway Administration to make effective investment and policy decisions to meet regional, statewide, and national transportation goals. ITD and COMPASS are required by federal regulation to coordinate on setting TPM performance measure targets for the state and the region. The performance measures cover transportation safety, asset management, system performance, and congestion. Targets are set for these measures on an annual basis for safety and on a four-year cycle for the other measures.

Historically, COMPASS has elected to support the statewide safety targets but has recently established its own regional targets in the Regional Safety Action Plan (RSAP). In December 2024, RTAC recommended COMPASS Board of Directors' adoption of the RSAP and supporting resolution setting a target of a 50% reduction in serious and fatal injury crashes by the year 2055. COMPASS staff recommend supporting ITD's statewide FY2025 targets for fatality and serious injury rates as in past years and setting regional targets that align with the RSAP.

The proposed targets for FY2025 are listed below:

- 5-Year Average Number of Fatalities: ≤47 (Regional)
- 5-Year Fatality Rate per 100 Million Vehicle Miles of Travel (VMT): ≤1.33 (Statewide)
- 5-Year Average Number of Serious Injuries: ≤**394 (Regional)**
- 5-Year Serious Injury Rate per 100 Million VMT: ≤6.82 (Statewide)
- 5-Year Average Number of Non-motorized Fatalities and Serious Injuries: ≤52 (Regional)

Implication (policy and/or financial):

If the state does not meet or make significant progress toward these targets, ITD loses flexibility to transfer Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) funds to other federal aid programs and must submit an HSIP implementation plan. There are no penalties for the MPO.

Topic: Introduction to COMPASS and RTAC

Request/Recommendation:

This is an information item only.

Summary:

The Regional Transportation Advisory Committee (RTAC) advises the COMPASS Board of Directors on regional transportation and related planning issues. Committee work includes recommending priorities for federal funding and reviewing and assisting in developing core agency documents such as the long-range transportation plan (*Communities in Motion*), regional transportation improvement program (TIP), and Unified Planning Work Program and Budget (UPWP).

RTAC members are the primary communication link between COMPASS and its member agencies and Board members. As such, RTAC members are expected to represent their respective agencies at RTAC meetings and communicate with their Board members regarding COMPASS plans, studies, and other activities.

Four COMPASS staff members serve as the staff liaison to RTAC on a rotating basis: Austin Miller, January – March; Meg Sonnen, April – June; Amy Luft, July – September; Toni Tisdale, October – December.

Multiple resources are available to assist RTAC members in preparing for upcoming meetings and/or reviewing the actions from previous meetings, including:

- Agendas, packets, meeting minutes, and supplementary information
 - Online (see below); meeting packet links are sent via email prior to each meeting
 - Each packet includes the "RTAC Agenda Worksheet" listing the topics planned for upcoming meetings; let COMPASS staff know if there are topics you would like to see
- "Keeping Up with COMPASS" newsletter
 - Outlines the actions of all COMPASS committees and workgroups, and the Board of Directors, to assist members in tracking the progress of actions as they move through the COMPASS process

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RTAC AGENDA ITEM V-B January 22, 2025

Topic: Amendment to the FY2025-2031 Regional Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Request/Recommendation:

COMPASS staff seeks RTAC recommendation of COMPASS Executive Committee's adoption of Resolution X-2025 (Attachment) modifying the FY2025-2031 TIP at the request of Valley Regional Transit and the Idaho Transportation Department.

Background/Summary

Action is needed from the COMPASS Board of Directors when a project increases by more than 30% and is more than \$1 million or when a project increases by more than \$5 million.

- Valley Regional Transit requested to increase their **rolling stock, infrastructure, and technology project** in FY2025, carrying over funds from FY2024 that were not obligated and increasing the amount to match the needs in VRT's budget. The increase is \$2,076,750, or 84.87%.
- The Idaho Transportation Department requested to increase the **Interstate 84 widening project between the Centennial Interchange and the Franklin Road Interchange** in the City of Caldwell. During review, staff determined that previous expenditures do not match the actual obligations that occurred in FY2024; therefore, adjustments are also proposed to match the actual obligations. The overall increase is \$5,500,470, or 4.67%. The increase is based on inflationary costs.

A public comment period was held January 6, 2025, through January 16, 2025, to address the proposed amendment to the FY2025-2031 TIP. Verbatim comments will be posted to the RTAC packet webpage under supplemental information on January 17, 2025 (see link below).

If recommended, staff will request adoption of the resolution by the COMPASS Executive Committee on February 4, 2025, followed by ratification of the action by the COMPASS Board of Directors on February 24, 2025.

Implication (policy and/or financial):

The amendment to the TIP ensures that the documents continue to meet federal fiscal constraint requirements and enables work to continue on these projects.

WHEREAS, the IIJA, Title 23 United States Code Section 134, and Title 49 United States Code Section 5303 require transportation improvement programs be developed in consultation with all interested parties;

WHEREAS, a public comment period was held from January 6, 2025, through January 16, 2025, and comments were shared with the COMPASS Executive Committee for consideration;

WHEREAS, the Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho desires to take timely action to ensure the availability of federal funds;

WHEREAS, the Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho developed this amendment to the FY2025-2031 Regional Transportation Improvement Program in compliance with all applicable state and federal regulations; and

WHEREAS, the attached table details the amendment to the FY2025-2031 Regional Transportation Improvement Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho's Executive Committee approves this amendment to the FY2025-2031 Regional Transportation Improvement Program.
