Topic: Transportation Management Area (TMA) Balancing

Request/Recommendation:

COMPASS staff requests RTAC approval to balance the Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG)-TMA program to use funding released from projects entering closeout.

Background/Summary

Balancing the STBG-TMA program allows available funds to be programmed for projects with funding needs. The FY2024 STBG-TMA program currently has \$611,000 available. The needs submitted by sponsoring agencies are provided in Attachment 1, along with funding recommendations from COMPASS staff.

COMPASS staff recommendations are based on priorities outlined in Board Policy 2021-01, "Balancing Policy for the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program and Transportation Alternatives Program Funds," approved by the COMPASS Board of Directors on February 22, 2021. The policy is available on the COMPASS website: https://compassidaho.org/wp-content/uploads/BalancingPolicy_FINAL_210222.pdf.

The proposed changes are shown in detail on the TMA balancing worksheet, provided in the RTAC supplemental due to the large page size (see link below). Letters of request from sponsoring agencies are provided in Attachment 2.

Implication (policy and/or financial):

The recommended staff actions allow full obligation of available STGB-TMA program funds in FY2024.

Dear Mr. Stoll:

ACHD would like to request \$155,000 in STBG-TMA funds to cover a series of cost overruns during construction (CN) for the FY 2021 Capital Maintenance Project - Phase 1 project (KN 18701). The overrun is a combination of several delays and numerous small materials cost increases that accumulated during construction. The most significant issue was postponing the construction on the Pleasant Valley Road segment twice. The delays were due to continued construction on the nearby Gowen Road bridge and later the rumored construction of underground utilities for an also rumored Amazon facility. When Pleasant Valley Road was finally paved, work was performed on four consecutive weekends with full road closures.

Please distribute available STBG-TMA funds within the project like this:

CC - \$468,700,000 + \$5,000 = \$473,700 CN - \$4,858,350 + \$150,000 = \$5,008,350

SUBJECT: Request for Surface Transportation Funding

SUMMARY:

VRT included improved pedestrian facilities and bus stop infrastructure at State and 23rd and State Street and 27th in its FY2022 RAISE grant application (Key number 23179). The cost estimates in the RAISE grant were based on high level concepts and focused on the transit amenities. As VRT worked with the City of Boise and ACHD to complete preliminary engineering it has became clear that there would be additional costs not anticipated in the original RAISE grant. These additional scope items include a complete signal replacement, which will result in upgraded signal equipment to meet current standards and upgrading pedestrian ramps and ADA facilities on all corners. These changes also resulted in additional right of way impacts and stormwater facility impacts.

VRT anticipates being able to cover some of these additional costs by rebalancing the RAISE funds however, the current cost estimate will exceed RAISE funding for these two projects by an estimated \$1,264,420 and is requesting STBG funds to cover this short fall. Any amount towards this shortfall will be useful to advance the project.

State and 23rd Street

There are sufficient RAISE funds for \$1,370,650 to go to State and 23rd. The current cost estimate is \$1,889,580 leaving a \$518,930 shortfall.

State and 27th Street

There are sufficient RAISE funds for \$903,000 to go to State and 27th. The current cost estimate for State and 23rd is \$1,648,490 leaving a \$745,490 shortfall.

Topic: FY2024 Statewide Safety Performance Targets

Request/Recommendation:

COMPASS staff seeks an RTAC recommendation to the COMPASS Board of Directors to adopt the Idaho Transportation Department (ITD's) FY2024 statewide safety performance targets.

Background/Summary:

Transportation Performance Management (TPM) is a strategic data-driven framework developed by the Federal Highway Administration to make effective investment and policy decisions to meet regional, statewide, and national transportation goals. ITD and COMPASS are required by federal regulation to coordinate on setting TPM performance measure targets for the state and the region. The performance measures cover transportation safety, asset management, system performance, and congestion. Targets are set for these measures on an annual basis for safety and on a four-year cycle for the other measures.

The statewide safety targets listed below have been established by the ITD's Office of Highway Safety for the following categories (using five-year averages from 2018-2022 as guidance):

- 5-Year Average Number of Fatalities: 238
- 5-Year Fatality Rate per 100 Million Vehicle Miles of Travel (VMT): 1.33
- 5-Year Average Number of Serious Injuries: 1,224
- 5-Year Serious Injury Rate per 100 Million VMT: 6.82
- 5-Year Average Number of Non-motorized Fatalities and Serious Injuries: 116

COMPASS has the option to support the statewide target or to establish a quantifiable target for the region. Historically, COMPASS has elected to support the statewide safety targets while also identifying aspiration goals in *Communities in Motion 2050*. COMPASS staff recommend supporting ITD's statewide targets for FY2024 as in past years but anticipates new targets for FY2025 that will be developed through the Regional Safety Action Plan currently underway.

Implication (policy and/or financial):

If the state does not meet or make significant progress toward these targets, ITD loses flexibility to transfer Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) funds to other federal aid programs and must submit an HSIP implementation plan.
