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## Topic: Federal-Aid Rankings for COMPASS Programs

## Request/ Recommendation:

COMPASS staff seeks RTAC recommendation of ranking of federal-aid projects.

## Background/ Summary:

Each year, COMPASS solicits funding applications for transportation needs through a two-phase approach. All applicants were required to submit a Phase I application; the deadline for Phase I applications for the FY2025-2031 funding cycle was December 5, 2023. COMPASS staff determined the funding eligibility of all applications. Members who submitted applications deemed eligible for federal-aid funding were requested to submit Phase II applications, providing additional information for the federal process, no later than January 18, 2024.

A total of 18 federal-aid-eligible applications were submitted, with the breakout listed below; a summary of these applications is provided in Attachment 1.

- Roadway - 11
- Alternative Transportation - 3
- Public Transportation - 0
- Studies/Special Projects - 4

The scoring system used for the preliminary ranking process is available in the COMPASS Application Guide online (link below). Roadway and alternative transportation projects were scored using criteria that directly tie to the goals and vision of Communities in Motion 2050. The applications were scored by COMPASS staff, using the approved criteria, to determine a score and preliminary ranking for each project. Preliminary rankings for federal-aid-eligible studies and special projects were developed based on RTAC member responses to an online paired comparison process, open between February 7 and February 16, 2024. Preliminary rankings for all types of federal-aid-eligible projects are provided in Attachment 2.

COMPASS staff hosted a voluntary workshop on February 7, 2024, to review each application and provide the opportunity for questions and discussion. All federal-aid-eligible applications were available for review by RTAC voting members after the workshop.

COMPASS staff requests RTAC review of the preliminary rankings, a discussion of possible changes (including breaking ties), and a recommendation of the final rankings. The recommended rankings will guide staff in developing a funding plan for federal-aid programs.

Timeline:
The timeline for the development of federal-aid programs is outlined below.

- March 13, 2024 - RTAC optional workshop
o Review federal-aid funding recommendations
- March 27, 2024 - RTAC requested to recommend draft federal-aid programs, which feed into the draft FY2025-2031 Regional Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)
- April 4, 2024 - Urban Balancing meeting (further ranking of Nampa Urban Area projects)
- May 22, 2024 - RTAC reviews draft FY2025-2031 TIP
- June 17, 2024 - COMPASS Board of Directors reviews draft FY2025-2031 TIP
- July 1-31, 2024 - Public comment period on draft FY2025-2031 TIP
- August 7, 2024 - RTAC requested to recommend FY2025-2031 TIP
- August 19, 2024 - COMPASS Board of Directors requested to approve FY2025-2031 TIP

COMPASS also has two non-federal programs, Communities in Motion Implementation Grants and the Project Development Program. The last opportunity to apply for FY2025 funds through these programs is May 1, 2024. An optional workshop will be held to discuss applications on June 5, 2024. RTAC will be requested to rank applications for these programs June 6-20, 2024. The rankings for these programs will be provided to RTAC on July 24, 2024, for recommendation to the COMPASS Board of Directors on August 19, 2024.

## Implication (policy and/ or financial):

The ranking process develops the priority order to fund new projects in all available federal-aid funding programs managed by COMPASS.

## Request/ Recommendation:

COMPASS staff requests RTAC recommendation of COMPASS Board of Directors' adoption of Resolution XXUAB-2024 (Attachment 1) approving a technical correction to Nampa's Adjusted Urban Area Boundary.

## Background/ Summary:

The U.S. Census Bureau reviews and updates urban and rural definitions and urban area boundaries (UABs) every ten years following and using data from the decennial census. They provide a baseline to a variety of data users, researchers, and analysts in a consistent and objective manner. In December 2022, urban areas were released, and as a result, five urban areas were delineated in the COMPASS planning area.

Developing adjusted UABs is an option to help remedy the "jagged" nature of boundaries and the noncontiguous urban areas as initially delineated by the Census Bureau and to help simplify programming, funding, and other processes. COMPASS developed adjusted UABs on behalf of its members in 2023. In October 2023, the COMPASS Board of Directors approved adjusted UABs for the Boise, Kuna, Middleton, Nampa, and Star urban areas, as recommended by RTAC in September 2023. Additional background and detail on this process can be found in the September 27, 2023, RTAC packet: https://compassidaho.org/wp-content/uploads/09272023_RTAC_Packet.pdf.

Subsequently, COMPASS staff determined that the Nampa adjusted UAB should extend to US 20/26 and include the full length of Northside and Franklin Boulevards, as this is a fast-growing area, and these high-priority corridors are currently on the federal aid functional classification system. Therefore, COMPASS staff recommends a technical correction to the Nampa adjusted UAB to include this area (Attachment 2). No other changes are proposed.


## Next Steps:

- April 15, 2024: COMPASS staff will request COMPASS Board of Directors' approval of the revised Nampa adjusted UAB.
- June 2024: Idaho Transportation Department (ITD) staff will present the adjusted urban area boundaries to the Idaho Transportation Board for approval. After Idaho Transportation Board approval, ITD staff will submit the materials to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA)-Idaho Division.


## I mplication (policy and/ or financial):

The UABs determine where, geographically, federal highway funds can be spent. Adjusting UABs will simplify federal funding eligibility, thereby allowing for more efficient and effective uses of these funds. Adjusting UABs does not change the overall amount of allocation nor the apportionment of federal funds to the COMPASS planning area.

The adjusted UABs are not official until approved by the COMPASS Board of Directors, the Idaho Transportation Board, and the FHWA-Idaho Division. Final approval by FHWA-Idaho Division is anticipated in summer 2024.

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration establishes geographic definitions (urban-rural) per 23 United States Code Section 101, and subsequent guidance is provided in 23 Code of Federal Regulations, Title 470;

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration uses urban-rural areas to determine federal highway funding levels;

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration allows adjustments to the urban area boundaries;

WHEREAS, the Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho prepared adjusted urban area boundaries within the planning area to simplify federal highway funding eligibility;

WHEREAS, a technical correction to the Nampa Adjusted Urban Boundary was made after adjusted urban area boundaries were approved by the COMPASS Board of Directors via Resolution No. 04-2024 on October 16, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the local jurisdictions within the Boise Urban Area, Kuna Urban Area, Star Urban Area, Nampa Urban Area, and Middleton Urban Area have agreed to the proposed adjustments to the United States Census Bureau designated urban area boundaries.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho Board of Directors does hereby approve the revised Nampa Adjusted Urban Area Boundary and affirm the Boise, Kuna, Star, and Middleton Adjusted Urban Area Boundaries as previously approved, to simplify federal highway funding eligibility.

## Topic: Balancing in the Transportation Management Area (TMA) and Large Urban (LU) Programs

## Request/ Recommendation:

COMPASS staff requests RTAC approval to balance the Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG)TMA, Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP)-TMA, Carbon Reduction Program (CRP)-TMA, and CRP-LU programs to allocate funding from releases from projects, requests for delay of funds, and unprogrammed funds to projects with immediate needs.

## Background/ Summary

Balancing the programs allows available funds to be budgeted for projects with funding needs. Only the CRP-LU program currently has unprogrammed funds in FY2024. However, requests from the Ada County Highway District and the City of Meridian to delay projects, and one request to release funds that were not needed, created a "domino" effect for balancing across four years, including FY2024. The needs submitted by sponsoring agencies, along with funding recommendations from COMPASS staff, are provided in the RTAC supplemental (link below).

The goal of balancing is to fully budget the current year's program. Because some requests were delayed phases of projects, the FY2024 program needed to be backfilled with projects, which entailed advancing future year projects/phases. It is important to note that all needs in the region are listed, but not all needs are eligible for every funding program.

COMPASS staff recommendations are based on priorities outlined in Board Policy 2021-01,
"Balancing Policy for the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program and Transportation
Alternatives Program Funds," approved by the COMPASS Board of Directors on February 22, 2021.

The proposed changes are shown in detail on the TMA balancing worksheet, provided in the RTAC supplemental (link below), and in the CRP-LU worksheet (Attachment 1). Letters of request from sponsoring agencies, including more details about the requests, are provided in Attachment 2.

## Implication (policy and/ or financial):

The recommended staff actions allow the obligation of available STGB-TMA, TAP-TMA, CRP-TMA, and CRP-LU program funds in FY2024. The recommendations do not fully use all available funding. Additional recommendations will be provided as project needs arise and funding is available.

The overall justification for the cost of construction in general is the original numbers for Grimes were generated some time in 2019/2020. We saw significant increases in cost of construction of the Phase 1\&2 Stoddard in 2021 versus the 2023 Stoddard pathway.

The revised funding totals are an estimate. For construction engineering the revised amount is based upon $15 \%$ of the revised construction costs. The estimate for construction was developed based upon the most recent pathway project, Stoddard. Stoddard pathway was 1500 LF of pathway at a cost of $\$ 426,000$ which works out to be a construction cost of $\$ 291 / \mathrm{LF}$. Grimes pathway is 2700 LF so at $\$ 300 / \mathrm{LF}$ of path we have a construction cost of $\$ 810,000$ however Stoddard had a significant cost associated with irrigation system. Due to the very limited right of way, there will be significantly less cost associated with irrigation. Also, there will be less cost associated with asphalt and base material as approximately 1000 LF of the path will only have approximately 5 ft of pathway width. Additionally, due to the limited access in approximately 1000 feet where we have only about 7.5 feet of right of way, this may cause construction costs to go up as the means and methods of the contractor will be very limited and cost increases have there been taken into account.

## SUMMARY:

VRT included improved pedestrian facilities and bus stop infrastructure at State and 23 rd and State Street and $27^{\text {th }}$ in its FY2022 RAISE grant application (Key number 23179). The cost estimates in the RAISE grant were based on high level concepts and focused on the transit amenities. As VRT worked with the City of Boise and ACHD to complete preliminary engineering it has became clear that there would be additional costs not anticipated in the original RAISE grant. These additional scope items include a complete signal replacement, which will result in upgraded signal equipment to meet current standards and upgrading pedestrian ramps and ADA facilities on all corners. These changes also resulted in additional right of way impacts and stormwater facility impacts.

VRT anticipates being able to cover some of these additional costs by rebalancing the RAISE funds however, the current cost estimate will exceed RAISE funding for these two projects by an estimated $\$ 1,264,420$ and is requesting STBG funds to cover this short fall. Any amount towards this shortfall will be useful to advance the project.

## State and $23^{\text {rd }}$ Street

There are sufficient RAISE funds for $\$ 1,370,650$ to go to State and 23 rd. The current cost estimate is $\$ 1,889,580$ leaving a $\$ 518,930$ shortfall.

## State and 27 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ Street

There are sufficient RAISE funds for $\$ 903,000$ to go to State and $27^{\text {th }}$. The current cost estimate for State and 23 rd is $\$ 1,648,490$ leaving a $\$ 745,490$ shortfall.

## Topic: COMPASS 2023 Data Bike Report

## Request/ Recommendation:

This is an information item only.

## Background/ Summary:

In 2018, COMPASS received a Technology Transfer Grant, facilitating the development of a "data bike" to collect pavement condition data in Ada and Canyon Counties. After testing in 2020, the bike was actively used in 2021 for pathway analysis, aiding maintenance prioritization. In 2023, COMPASS conducted its largest data collection, covering 54 out of 86 miles of multi-use pathways. This data is crucial for planners, identifying maintenance needs for safety and infrastructure conditions, and establishing a baseline for future trends.

Results from the 2023 pathway inspections reveal that $42 \%$ of pathways are in good condition. Opportunities for improvement exist, with only $5 \%$ meeting an excellent standard. Focusing on the $33 \%$ in fair condition and addressing the $12 \%$ poor and $9 \%$ very poor pathways presents a significant chance to enhance overall conditions. Optimistically, positive trends are expected in the next two years as changes are monitored and improvements implemented.

The Trail Roughness Index (TRI) is used to assess surface conditions, crucial for activities like biking or walking. The TRI calculates roughness via vertical displacement along a pathway. Pathways receive an overall grade (A through F) based on an average TRI score. This evaluation considers specific areas' impact on the overall pathway experience, ensuring a comprehensive assessment.

This data collection serves member agencies, providing them with valuable insights to be used at their discretion. However, it is intended to encourage and support funding and planning for pathway maintenance, ensuring a positive experience for users.

## Background/ Summary:

Alternative fuels, including hydrogen, natural gas, propane, and electric vehicles (EVs), are emerging technologies nationwide and within the Treasure Valley. As both local governments and private residents transition to alternative fuels, including EVs, planning for charging and fueling locations and infrastructure is necessary for the region's future.

To that end, COMPASS is preparing for a study to summarize existing conditions and trends, investigate the constraints facing alternative fueling and EV charging infrastructure, and identify opportunities to coordinate investments in this infrastructure at equitable locations across the region.

This project will build on the state's National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) corridor plan and will further analyze the implication of the state's plans and policies on the COMPASS region. The findings from this project will be used to support future policy and funding pursuits for the implementation of charging and fueling infrastructure as well as COMPASS planning efforts.

In this meeting COMPASS staff will provide an overview of the existing resources for alternative fuel and EV infrastructure, discuss the draft scope of work (attached), and seek feedback from members of RTAC on the study.

## Draft Scope of Work: COMPASS Alternative Fuel and Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Deployment Study

The Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho (COMPASS), the metropolitan planning organization for Ada and Canyon Counties, Idaho, is seeking a qualified consultant to conduct a regional Alternative Fuel and Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Deployment Study.

The Federal Highway Administration's National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) funding program was authorized as part of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act to "provide funding to states to strategically deploy electric vehicle (EV) charging stations and to establish an interconnected network to facilitate data collection, access, and reliability." ${ }^{1}$

The Idaho Transportation Department recently completed a statewide NEVI plan that aligns with the department's statewide priorities. ${ }^{2}$ COMPASS's Alternative Fuel and Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Study will expand upon the state's NEVI plan by providing information about EVs as well as additional types of alternative fueled vehicles and charging stations relevant to the region.

The primary objective of this study is to understand the existing conditions of alternative fuel vehicles and fueling stations in the region and to provide guidance to local jurisdictions in Ada and Canyon Counties for accessing funding and developing policies for alternative fuel infrastructure.

The project will involve two primary deliverables with five key tasks, described below.

## Deliverable: Alternative Fuels Plan Document

1. Conduct background research on basics on alternative fuel vehicles.
a. Summary of alternative fuel vehicles including information of what types of alternative fuel vehicles exist, fundamentals of how they are fueled, comparison of tailpipe emissions by type, and national trends of the adoption of alternative fuel vehicles by type.
b. Analysis of national barriers to the adoption of alternative fuel vehicles by type such as gaps in fueling station service, weather related concerns, multi-family housing access to electric vehicle charging stations, etc.
c. Analysis of local barriers to the adoption of alternative fuel vehicles by type.
2. Describe local conditions of alternative fuel vehicles.
a. Analysis of current alternative fuel vehicles in the region by type.
b. Forecast of future alternative fuel vehicles in the region by type based on local and national trends.

3. Develop a guide for alternative fueling station implementation for public, commercial, and fleet use.

c. Key considerations for the construction of fueling stations for public, commercial, and fleet use.

## Deliverable: Alternative Fuels Web Map Tool

4. Identify and map geographic areas most in need of alterative fuel infrastructure by fuel type and primary users including:
a. Urban light-duty vehicles
b. Rural light-duty vehicles
c. Disadvantaged communities
5. Develop a fact sheet of key considerations associated with the forecasted need shown on the map.
