# FINANCE COMMITTEE AGENDA ITEM IV-A DATE: APRIL 5, 2023

**Topic: FY2024 General and Special Membership Dues** 

### Request/Recommendation:

COMPASS staff seeks a recommendation of the updated proposed FY2024 membership dues for COMPASS Board of Directors' approval.

## Background/Summary:

At its March 23, 2023, meeting, the Finance Committee recommended the proposed FY2024 membership dues.

The proposed dues were calculated using the Member Dues Calculation Policy approved by the COMPASS Board at its January 26, 2015, meeting. The calculation method is the estimated population in the jurisdiction multiplied by the proportionate share of population for that jurisdiction multiplied by the per capita rate.

Subsequent to the March 23, 2023, Finance Committee meeting, staff found a typo in the persons per household for the City of Star's population estimate in Ada County. When the new population is inputted into the proposed FY2024 membership dues calculations, there is an increase in proposed membership dues for the City of Star, Ada County and Ada County Highway District. The corrected population and corrected proposed dues are shown on the attached table. Total dues increased by \$2,445, with \$815 of that total allocated to City of Star, Ada County and Ada County Highway District.

Additionally, staff has updated the presentation of City of Star population. Most City of Star residents live in Ada County but some live in Canyon County. In FY2021, the estimated number of Star/Canyon County residents was 10. In FY2022, this number grew to 280 and in FY2023, it grew to 500. Staff has historically adjusted the dues for the affected member agencies to account for the Star/Canyon County residents, but the adjustment was embedded in the formulas and not readily apparent on the tables presented to the Finance Committee. For transparency, the presentation has been updated to show the Star/Canyon County residents on the table. This presentation update did not change the dues for City of Star, Canyon County or Canyon County Highway District No. 4 as the residents had been accounted for in the formula. Total proposed dues for City of Star are the Ada County portion (\$7,579) and the Canyon County portion (\$220) added together, for a total of \$7,799.

## Implication (policy and/or financial):

The proposed dues will be used in the development of the draft FY2024 Unified Planning Work Program and Budget to be presented to the Finance Committee in its June 15, 2023, meeting.
