He also announced that there will not be an April Executive Committee Meeting and reminded members that in May they will be discussing the Executive Director's annual evaluation for presentation to the Board at their June meeting. He also announced that at the June Executive Committee meeting consultants for COMPASS' Regional Housing Study will present a status report on the study.

Topic: Project Milestone Report

Request/Recommendation:

Background/Summary:

On February 22, 2016, the COMPASS Board of Directors directed COMPASS staff to develop a milestone report of projects funded through COMPASS. Background/Summary:

RTAC Bylaws state that the RTAC Chair will submit a monthly status report on RTAC activities to the COMPASS Executive Committee. Below is an outline of agenda items and actions from the March 15, 2023, and April 26, 2023, meetings.

SPECIAL ITEMS

Carbon Reduction Program

RTAC received a status report from the Idaho Transportation Department (ITD) on the new federal Carbon Reduction Program. (April 26, 2023)

Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-Saving Transportation program

RTAC received a status report from ITD on the new federal Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-Saving Transportation (PROTECT) program. (April 26, 2023)

ACTION ITEMS

Balancing Actions in the Transportation Management Areas

RTAC recommended balancing the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) in the Transportation Management Area (TMA) by allocating available funding to the City of Boise to advance and combine two pathway improvement projects along State Highway 55. (March 15, 2023)

Funding Plans for Federal Aid Programs

RTAC recommended updates to formula-based federal-aid programs (Surface Transportation Block Grant [STBG]-TMA, TAP-TMA, STBG-Urban, Carbon Reduction Program [CRP]-TMA, and CRP-Urban) for FY2024-2030 to be included in the draft FY2024-2030 Regional Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The full draft FY2024-2030 TIP will be brought to RTAC for review in its May 24, 2023, meeting. (March 15, 2023)

FY2023-2029 Regional TIP

RTAC recommended COMPASS Board of Directors' adoption of a Board Administrative Modification to the FY2023-2029 TIP to increase the cost of four Valley Regional Transit projects and to increase the cost and advance a COMPASS project to develop a Regional Safety Action Plan. COMPASS received a nationally competitive grant to develop this plan, allowing it to be advanced. This item was adopted by the COMPASS Board of Directors in its April 17, 2023, meeting. (March 15, 2023)

RTAC discussed a proposed amendment to the FY2023-2029 Regional Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add an ITD project to evaluate signal operations and maintenance practices on state routes in Ada County. This item will be continued in the May 24, 2023, RTAC meeting to allow time for outstanding questions to be addressed. (April 26, 2023)

Member Agencies' Requests for FY2024 Unified Planning Work Program

RTAC recommended priority rankings of member agency requests for COMPASS' FY2024 Unified Planning Work Program and Budget (UPWP). The COMPASS Finance Committee will balance the priorities with available resources and recommend a final UPWP for COMPASS Board of Directors' approval in August. (March 15, 2023)

High-Capacity Transit Planning and Environmental Linkages Study

RTAC recommended COMPASS Board of Directors' acceptance of a draft scope of work for a high-capacity transit Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) study to be used in a future Request for Proposals, as recommended by the Planning and Environmental Linkages Workgroup. This item was approved by the COMPASS Board of Directors in its April 17, 2023, meeting. (March 15, 2023)

2023 Statewide Safety Performance Targets

RTAC recommended COMPASS Board of Directors' adoption of the ITD's annual statewide safety performance targets. Per federal law, metropolitan planning organizations, such as COMPASS, must establish annual safety targets, either by supporting statewide targets or setting regional targets. This item was approved by the COMPASS Board of Directors in its April 17, 2023, meeting. (March 15, 2023)

Chinden Boulevard Pedestrian Crossing Project

RTAC accepted a proposal to request public comment on a proposal to change the scope of work on a pedestrian crossing project on US 20/26 (Chinden Boulevard) to move the project from 43rd Street to 32nd or 33rd Streets. The public comment materials will note that work will continue to find a solution to address pedestrian crossing safety issues at the Chinden Boulevard/43rd Street intersection. (April 26, 2023)

INFORMATION ITEMS

2020 Census Urbanized Area Results and Implementation of Idaho Transportation Board Policy 4028

RTAC received a status report on 2020 Census urbanized area results and implications to the COMPASS planning area and an update on implementation of Idaho Transportation (IT) Board Policy 4028. (March 15, 2023)
