August 7, 2024, RTAC Meeting Minutes Recommend 2024 Transit Asset Management Performance Targets Recommend Support of Priorities for Rural Projects

RTAC approved the consent agenda.

#### **SPECIAL ITEM**

#### **Impact of Inflation on Transportation Projects**

RTAC received an overview from the Ada County Highway District and Idaho Transportation Department regarding how inflation has affected the cost of transportation projects.

#### **ACTION ITEMS**

#### Recommend the FY2025 COMPASS Resource Development Plan

RTAC recommended COMPASS Board of Directors' approval of the FY2025 Resource Development Plan, which outlined projects that the Resource Development Team may work on to seek funding. This item will be brought to the COMPASS Board of Directors for action at its October 21, 2024, meeting.

#### Recommend an Amendment to Communities in Motion 2050

RTAC recommended COMPASS Board of Directors' adoption of an amendment to Communities in Motion 2050 to add a project to widen State Highway 16 from State Highway 44 to Beacon Light Road near the Cities of Eagle and Star. This project had been identified as a high priority, but unfunded, project in Communities in Motion 2050. This item will be brought to the COMPASS Board of Directors for action at its October 21, 2024, meeting.

# Recommend an Amendment to the FY2024-2030 and FY2025-2031 Regional Transportation Improvement Programs (TIPs)

RTAC recommended COMPASS Board of Directors' adoption of amendments to the FY2024-2030 and FY2025-2031 Regional Transportation Improvement Programs (TIPs) to add two funded projects, advance one project, and change the scope of four projects. This item will be brought to the COMPASS Board of Directors for action at its October 21, 2024, meeting.
