## Methodology

Population estimates are calculated as:
Population $=[(\mathbf{h}+\mathbf{r}) * \mathbf{s} * \mathbf{o})]+\mathbf{q}$

Where:
h = decennial census households
$\mathbf{r}=$ new residential units permitted
s = household size
o $=$ residential occupancy rate
$\mathbf{q}=$ group quarters population

Note:

- Population is assigned to cities/counties based on end-ofyear city limits.
- Household sizes data from the Census Bureau
- Residential occupancy rates data from and Idaho Power

## Vacancy Rates

Census

- Census (1990-2013)
- Census American Community Survey (2014)

Idaho Power (2015)

- Observed individual residential meter use compared to historical occupied use.
- Defines "vacant" as usage below a threshold value (45\% of expected energy use)

## Methodology Differences



- COMPASS uses local information on building permits and vacancy rates
- COMPASS estimates are reviewed by local expertsbuilders, utility companies, agency staff, etc.
- Census estimate is modeled from national and state data and hasn't been updated since 2013

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## Conclusion

- Population estimates have a variety of uses including planning, grant-writing, and COMPASS member dues.
- Region has added 5,657 housing units last year and almost 17,000 housing units since 2010.
- Better, local data! Demographic Advisory Committee recommended using Idaho Power's vacancy rate data based on electrical loads.
- Residential vacancy rates have dropped from 7.4\% in 2010 to 4.2\% today.
