Decisions such as how much parking should be provided, where it should go, and whether or not to charge for it (and, if so, how much) all have an impact on everything from economic development to the use of public transportation, walking, and cycling. In addition, questions abound as to how the increase in ride hailing (e.g., Uber and Lyft) and future autonomous vehicles may impact the demand for parking.
