Communities in Motion 2040 2.0 Development Review

The Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho (COMPASS) is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for Ada and Canyon Counties. COMPASS has developed this review as a tool for local governments to evaluate whether land developments are consistent with the goals of *Communities in Motion 2040 2.0* (CIM 2040), the regional long-range transportation plan for Ada and Canyon Counties. This checklist is not intended to be prescriptive, but rather a guidance document based on CIM 2040 2.0 goals.

Recommendations

The location is an area designated as "Mixed Use" in the *Communities in Motion* Vision. It is an infill site, which provides additional employment access to thousands of homes in the area. This location may reduce trip length to employment and encourage bicycle and pedestrian use. The site is served by route #42 less than 1mile from this location, with service from Caldwell to the Boise Towne Square Mall. ValleyConnect 2.0 proposes additional bus service near this location, providing access to the College of Western Idaho, the Meridian Village, downtown Boise, and other locations.
