Communities in Motion 2040 Development Review

The Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho (COMPASS) is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for Ada and Canyon Counties. COMPASS has developed this review as a tool for local governments to evaluate whether land developments are consistent with the goals of *Communities in Motion 2040 (CIM 2040)*, the regional long-range transportation plan for Ada and Canyon Counties. This checklist is not intended to be prescriptive, but rather a guidance document based on CIM 2040 goals.

Recommendations

The proposal did not provide a site plan but fronts Highway 16, which is in the *Communities in Motion 2040* plan as the #5 regional priority corridor. Highway 16 is the main commuter route from Gem County to the Treasure Valley. ITD has studied the creation of an expressway to extend Highway 16 to connect to I-84. Increased access locations can reduce traffic flow and make additional conflict points for pedestrians and bicyclists.
