## Communities in Motion 2040 Development Review

The Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho (COMPASS) is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for Ada and Canyon Counties. COMPASS has developed this review as a tool for local governments to evaluate whether land developments are consistent with the goals of Communities in Motion 2040 (CIM 2040), the regional long-range transportation plan for Ada and Canyon Counties. This checklist is not intended to be prescriptive, but rather a guidance document based on CIM 2040 goals.

## Recommendations

The proposal would provide access from Happy Valley Road. Happy Valley Road is identified as the \#31 priority corridor in the regional transportation plan, Communities in Motion 2040. Happy Valley Road serves eastern Nampa and is an alternate route to 12th Avenue/State Highway 45. Currently the property is served by multiple, wide driveways, which can cause safety issues on Happy Valley Road. Consider reducing access to a single, defined driveway to help this corridor functions efficiently and is safe for non-motorized use.

Long-range public transportation plans call for a new east/west bus route on Victory Road connecting the Downtown Nampa to the Boise Airport with 30 -minute headways during peak hours and 60 -minute headways during off-peak hours.
