Communities in Motion 2040 2.0 Development Review

The Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho (COMPASS) is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for Ada and Canyon Counties. COMPASS has developed this review as a tool for local governments to evaluate whether land developments are consistent with the goals of *Communities in Motion 2040 2.0* (CIM 2040), the regional long-range transportation plan for Ada and Canyon Counties. This checklist is not intended to be prescriptive, but rather a guidance document based on CIM 2040 2.0 goals.

Recommendations

Greenhurst Road has been identified as the #10 local, unfunded priority in CIM 2040 2.0. This project would widen Greenhurst from two to three lanes from Southside Blvd to Happy Valley Road. There are no plans for public transportation service to this area.

Consider a public multi-use pathway along the Elijah Drain. When this pathway is completed it will provide access from southeast Nampa to Northwest Nazarene University and downtown Nampa. Providing access to the Elijah Drain pedestrian bridge would enable residents of this development better access to Osborne Park. The sidewalk is not contiguous between this location to East Valley Middle School, approximately one half mile to the east.
