## Communities in Motion 2040 Development Review

## Recommendations

The proposal fronts both State Highway 55 (Karcher Road) and the Caldwell-Nampa Boulevard (the Boulevard). Karcher Road is a regional freight corridor, connecting the valley to the west coast and is considered the \#4 priority in the Communities in Motion 2040 regional plan. The Boulevard is a key commercial arterial connecting the two largest cities in Canyon County and is considered the \#9 priority in the Communities in Motion 2040 regional plan. Good land use, transportation demand management, and access management is critical to maintain efficiencies on this corridor. This proposal exceeds growth forecasted for this area. Transportation infrastructure may not be able to support the new transportation demands. However, some of the additional automobile traffic generated by this proposal may be mitigated by improved multi-modal services, including sidewalks, bicycle lanes, and public transportation. This location is currently served by three bus routes (routes 45, 52, and 55) which connect to downtown Caldwell and along the Interstate to downtown Boise.

The site plan shows two access points onto the Boulevard and two access points to Karcher Road. Increased ingress and egress locations can reduce traffic flow and make additional conflict points for pedestrians and bicyclists. Consider reducing access points to both Nampa-Caldwell Boulevard and Karcher Road.
