## Communities in Motion 2040 2.0 Development Review

The Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho (COMPASS) is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for Ada and Canyon Counties. COMPASS has developed this review as a tool for local governments to evaluate whether land developments are consistent with the goals of *Communities in Motion 2040 2.0* (CIM 2040), the regional long-range transportation plan for Ada and Canyon Counties. This checklist is not intended to be prescriptive, but rather a guidance document based on CIM 2040 2.0 goals.

## Recommendations

This proposal exceeds growth forecasted for this area. Transportation infrastructure may not be able to support the new transportation demands. The proposal is on the fringe of urban development in an area removed from employment centers. Nearby services, such as parks, emergency services, grocery, and other stores are likely accessed only by vehicle. Van Buren Elementary School is approximately 0.6 miles to the west, however, there is insufficient sidewalks and/or bike lanes on Marble Front Road. Consider providing infrastructure that would encourage non-motorized travel to the school. The closest transit services are located more than two miles away. ValleyConnect 2.0 proposes bus service on US 20/26 serving downtown Caldwell and downtown Nampa with 60-minute frequencies. The closest bus stop would be approximately ½ mile in distance when that route is operational.
