## Communities in Motion 2040 Development Review

The Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho (COMPASS) is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for Ada and Canyon Counties. COMPASS has developed this review as a tool for local governments to evaluate whether land developments are consistent with the goals of *Communities in Motion 2040 (CIM 2040)*, the regional long-range transportation plan for Ada and Canyon Counties. This checklist is not intended to be prescriptive, but rather a guidance document based on CIM 2040 goals.

## Recommendations

The location is an infill site with thousands of jobs within a mile of the site. Additionally, it is within a walkable or bikeable distance to Major Activity Centers, a public park and a grocery store. This location may reduce trip length and encourage bicycle and pedestrian use. The proposal provides transit-oriented density housing within a walkable distance to two bus routes:

- Route 3 runs along Vista from downtown Boise to the Boise Airport. ValleyConnect 2.0 proposes increasing peak frequencies to 15-minutes along this route.
- Route 29 runs from Boise State University along Overland Road to the Boise Towne Square Mall.
   ValleyConnect 2.0 proposes extending coverage to the Meridian Village and increasing frequencies to 15-minutes.
