
Communities in Motion (CIM) Development Review Checklist



Comments:

The proposal is in an area removed from employment centers and existing public transportation. In the future, the <u>2050 Treasure Valley Public Transportation System</u> shows an unfunded bus route on Ustick Road from downtown Caldwell to St. Luke's on North Eagle Road.

Who we are: The Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho (COMPASS) is the metropolitan planning organization for Ada and Canyon Counties. This review evaluates whether land developments are consistent with <u>Communities in Motion</u>, the regional long-range transportation plan for Ada and Canyon Counties. Fiscal Impact Analysis

Below are the expected revenues and costs to local governments from this project. The purpose of this analysis is to help the public, stakeholders, and the decision-makers better manage growth.

Capital and operating expenditures are determined based on service and infrastructure needs, including persons per household, student generation rates, lot sizes, street frontages, vehicle trip and trip adjustment factors, average trip lengths, construction values, income, discretionary spending, and employment densities.

Long-Term Funded and Unfunded Capital Projects

CIM Priority Corridor: Ustick Road (Midland Boulevard to Star Road)

Widening Ustick Road (Midland Boulevard to Star Road) to five lanes with curb, gutter, sidewalks, and bike lanes is the number 3 local system priority in *Communities in Motion 2050* and is unfunded.
