Topic: Draft Communities in Motion 2050 and Public Comment

Background/Summary:

COMPASS develops the regional long-range transportation plan for Ada and Canyon Counties. The current plan, *Communities in Motion 2040 2.0*, (CIM 2040 2.0) was adopted in 2018. The plan must be updated every four years and have a minimum 20-year horizon. The next update, *Communities in Motion 2050* (CIM 2050), will plan to a horizon year of 2050 and is scheduled to be presented to the COMPASS Board of Directors for adoption in December 2022.

The goal of *Communities in Motion* is to ensure that the Treasure Valley – Ada and Canyon Counties – remains a healthy and economically vibrant region that offers people choices in how and where they live, work, play, and travel. To do that, CIM 2050 forecasts how the region is expected to grow, anticipates the transportation needs to accommodate that growth, and prioritizes projects to meet those needs.

Since 2019, COMPASS staff have received significant public input and worked closely with RTAC, COMPASS workgroups, and the COMPASS Board of Directors to develop the policies and decisions that comprise the "meat" of the plan. Those key policies and decisions include:

- A forecasted population of 1.075 million in Ada and Canyon Counties by 2050 (approved by the COMPASS Board of Directors December 2019)
- CIM 2050 goals and objectives (approved December 2020)
- Regional rail on the Boise Cutoff alignment as the locally favored high-capacity transit option south of the Boise River (approved June 2021)
- The CIM 2050 Vision, the preferred growth and transportation scenario to 2050 for Ada and Canyon Counties (approved August 2021)
- CIM 2050 performance measures and targets (approved October 2021)
- A funding policy to guide allocation of federal transportation funding (approved October 2021)
- A complete network policy a regional, multimodal, integrated, vision for transportation corridors (approved December 2021)
- Projects that are funded in the plan (approved April 2022)
- Projects that are prioritized for funding by 2030 and unfunded improvements and studies (approved June 2022)
- CIM 2050 implementation policies (approved June 2022)

CIM 2050 will be an online "document" consisting of public-friendly web pages covering the different topics in the plan, with links to technical documents ("chapters") for more detailed information.

The public comment period on the draft CIM 2050 plan will be September 16 - October 16, 2022. While member agencies do not need to submit comments on the draft plan, RTAC members are encouraged to share public comment materials with your agencies' constituents to encourage broad public feedback.

Topic: Planning and Environmental Linkages Workgroup

Request/Recommendation

This is an information item.

Background/Summary:

During the development of *Communities in Motion 2050* (CIM 2050), COMPASS identified several promising modes and alignments for a future high-capacity transit service connecting the Cities of Caldwell and Boise, roughly parallel to Interstate 84 south of the Boise River. Those modes and alignments were further analyzed in light of public preferences expressed in a 2021 COMPASS survey. Based on those analyses, in June 2021 the COMPASS Board of Directors approved regional rail on the Boise Cutoff alignment as the "locally-favored" high-capacity transit option for CIM 2050. As a next step in the planning process, in June 2022, the COMPASS Board of Directors directed staff to fund a high-capacity transit Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) study in the draft FY2023-2029 Regional Transportation Improvement Program.

COMPASS proposes a workgroup be established to guide that study. The attached draft Planning and Environmental Linkages Workgroup charter identifies the proposed 2023 tasks, deliverables, and membership. The primary 2023 task and deliverable will be to develop a scope of work for the forthcoming PEL study. The proposed membership is diverse and consists of member agency staff and elected officials and federal agency staff. In addition to developing the scope of work, the workgroup will also play a key role in bringing stakeholders from across the region together to discuss high-capacity transit.

COMPASS staff requests feedback on the draft charter. It will be presented to the COMPASS Executive Committee in its September 13, 2022, meeting with a request for recommendation of COMPASS Board of Directors' approval.

Topic: FY2023 Resource Development Plan

Request/Recommendation:

This is an information and discussion item only.

Background/Summary:

The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) will result in large volumes of available competitive grant funds for transportation-related projects over the next five years. An example of this is the recent RAISE grant awards and current Safe Streets and Roads for All regional grant application. The more total awards received in the Treasure Valley, the quicker priority projects can be funded by grants as well as formula funds through balancing. This opportunity coincides with rapid population growth and associated development variables in alignment with *Communities in Motion 2050*, the regional long-range transportation plan, making timely project development, design, and construction a priority.

The combination of new grant opportunities and the anticipated adoption of *Communities in Motion 2050* in December 2022 will require an update to the draft FY2023 Resource Development Plan to ensure it accurately reflects priority projects and new funding streams. The draft FY2023 Resource Development Plan will be posted as supplemental information on the RTAC webpage when the draft is complete (see link below). Projects not in the plan will not receive support from COMPASS. COMPASS staff will share anticipated updates to the plan and solicit feedback from member agencies.

As these updates may alter your agency's priorities, COMPASS is offering the chance to add projects to the draft FY2023 Resource Development Plan before it is adopted in October 2022.

If your agency would like to request a project be added to the draft FY2023 Resource Development Plan, please send a letter requesting the addition to Joey Schueler by close of business, September 15, 2022.

Next Steps:

A new Grant Resource Alignment Workgroup will begin meeting in October. The group will create an annual grant calendar to help avoid bottlenecks around grant submittal deadlines and will meet quarterly to strategize ways to collaborate. Anyone involved in grant writing is invited to join.

The call for projects for the **FY2024** Resource Development Plan will open in October; the letters of request due on September 15, 2022, are for projects to be added to the draft **FY2023** Resource Development Plan only.
