Communities in Motion 2040 Development Review

The Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho (COMPASS) is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for Ada and Canyon Counties. COMPASS has developed this review as a tool for local governments to evaluate whether land developments are consistent with the goals of *Communities in Motion 2040 (CIM 2040)*, the regional long-range transportation plan for Ada and Canyon Counties. This checklist is not intended to be prescriptive, but rather a guidance document based on CIM 2040 goals.

Recommendations

The proposal is adjacent to Ridgevue High School enabling non-motorized trips to the school and potentially mitigating the impacts of increased automobile traffic. Consider a safe pedestrian crossing of the new Linden Road to promote safety. ValleyConnect 2.0 does not propose bus services in the area in the Intermediate or Growth scenario.

Franklin Road is identified in Nampa's 2011 Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan as having a public multiuse pathway in the future. To facilitate connectivity, consider additional pathways from within the development to Franklin Road. The Groves Branch Lateral to the south of the site provides an opportunity for trail recreation for the area. The <u>Idaho Recreational Use Statute (36-1604)</u> protects and encourages private landowners to allow access to land for recreational purposes.
