## Communities in Motion 2040 2.0 Development Review


#### Abstract

The Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho (COMPASS) is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for Ada and Canyon Counties. COMPASS has developed this review as a tool for local governments to evaluate whether land developments are consistent with the goals of Communities in Motion 20402.0 (CIM 2040), the regional long-range transportation plan for Ada and Canyon Counties. This checklist is not intended to be prescriptive, but rather a guidance document based on CIM 20402.0 goals.

## Recommendations

Ustick Road has been identified in the Communities in Motion 20402.0 plan as the \#7 local, unfunded corridor. This project would widen Ustick Road to five lanes with curb, gutter, sidewalks, and bike lanes between Montana Avenue to Ten Mile Road. Currently, this location is in a predominately farmland area. Nearby services, such as schools, parks, grocery, and other services are likely accessed only by vehicle and there are no plans for public transportation to this location. The 2011 Nampa Bike/Ped plan identified the Purdam Drain as a public multi-use pathway. It appears that this proposal includes this pathway which would eventually connect to activity centers like the College of Western Idaho, the Idaho Center, and downtown Nampa. The proposal also includes a stub road to the west which will enable future connectivity to East Canyon Elementary School.
