## Communities in Motion 2040 2.0 Development Review

The Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho (COMPASS) is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for Ada and Canyon Counties. COMPASS has developed this review as a tool for local governments to evaluate whether land developments are consistent with the goals of Communities in Motion 20402.0 (CIM 2040), the regional long-range transportation plan for Ada and Canyon Counties. This checklist is not intended to be prescriptive, but rather a guidance document based on CIM 20402.0 goals.

## Recommendations

This proposal exceeds growth forecasted for this area. Transportation infrastructure may not be able to support the new transportation demands. However, the proposal provides an opportunity for development in an enclave of the City of Nampa which may reduce trip length and encourage bicycle and pedestrian use. The site is served by Valley Regional Transit Route 40 from the Nampa Transit Center to downtown Boise with 30 -minute frequencies in the peak hour. ValleyConnect 2.0 proposes that route will eventually serve the Boise Airport and Micron. The closest bus stop is less than $1 / 4$ mile away.

The State Highway 45 reroute is the \#11 locally unfunded priority in Communities in Motion 2040 2.0. The reroute may change traffic patterns along Northside Boulevard as this project would expand capacity on 7th St South and Yale Avenue to a five-Iane facility and connect vehicles to Northside Boulevard.
