## Communities in Motion 2040 2.0 Development Review

The Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho (COMPASS) is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for Ada and Canyon Counties. COMPASS has developed this review as a tool for local governments to evaluate whether land developments are consistent with the goals of *Communities in Motion 2040 2.0* (CIM 2040), the regional long-range transportation plan for Ada and Canyon Counties. This checklist is not intended to be prescriptive, but rather a guidance document based on CIM 2040 2.0 goals.

## Recommendations

This proposal exceeds growth forecasted for this area. However, the location is an infill site in an employment-centric area, with thousands of jobs within a mile of the site. Additionally, it is within a walkable or bikeable distance to Major Activity Centers, such as downtown Boise and Boise State University. This location may reduce trip length and encourage bicycle and pedestrian use. The proposal provides an opportunity for a high-density development supportive of nearby bus service. Valley Regional Transit provides fixed-route services at this location. Specifically, the Roosevelt Route (#4) and the Emerald Route (#5) have bus stops on Americana Boulevard. Both routes have 30-minute frequencies during the weekday peak hour. ValleyConnect 2.0 plans increased frequencies for these routes. Nearby public schools are not within walking distance. Work with the Boise School District to ensure that there is a safe and accessible location for school bus pickup and dropoff.
