

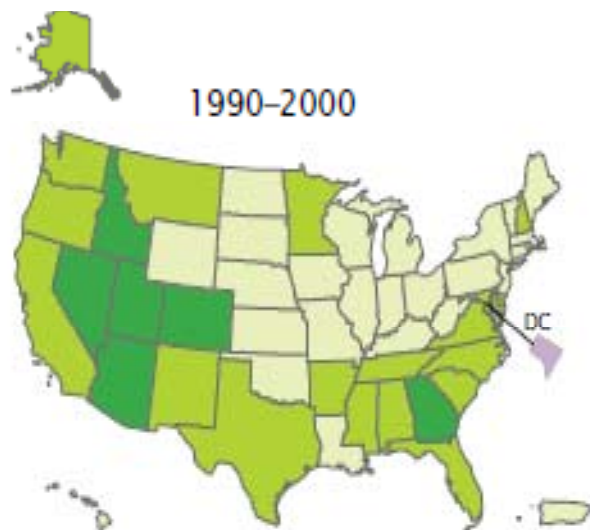

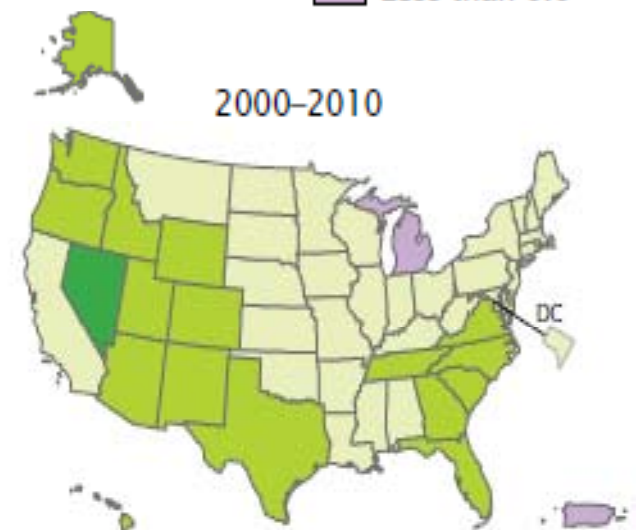
Population Growth for States by Decade

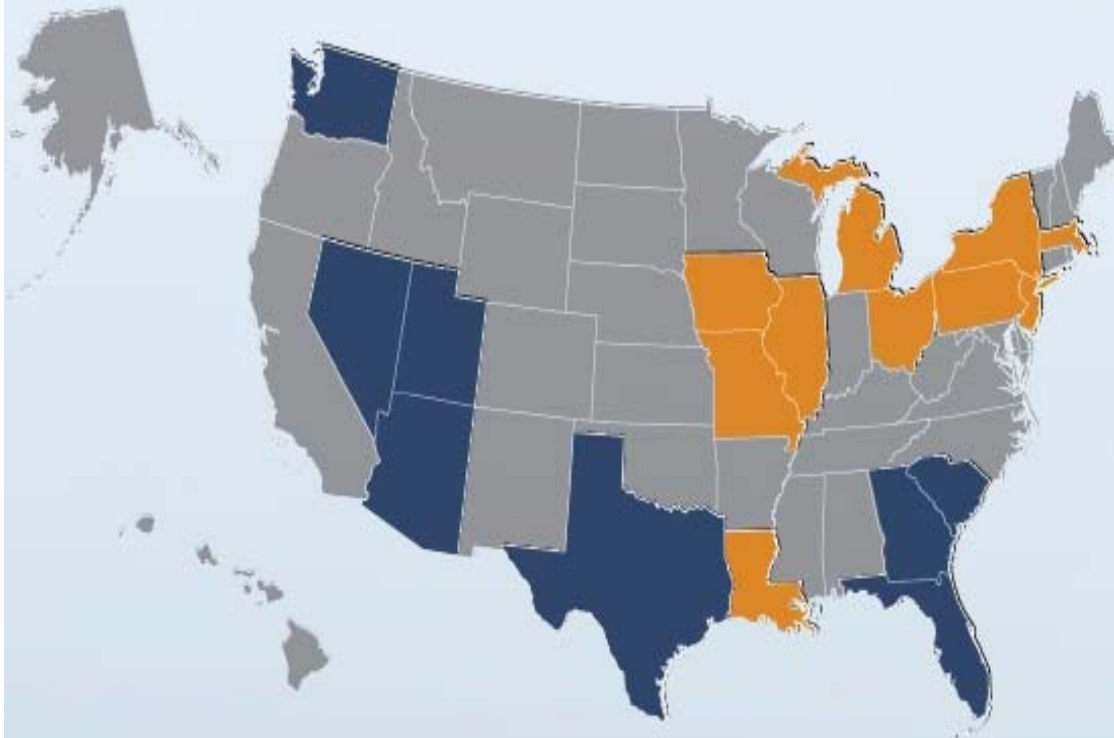

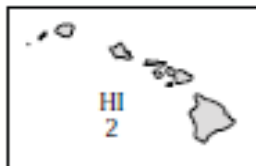
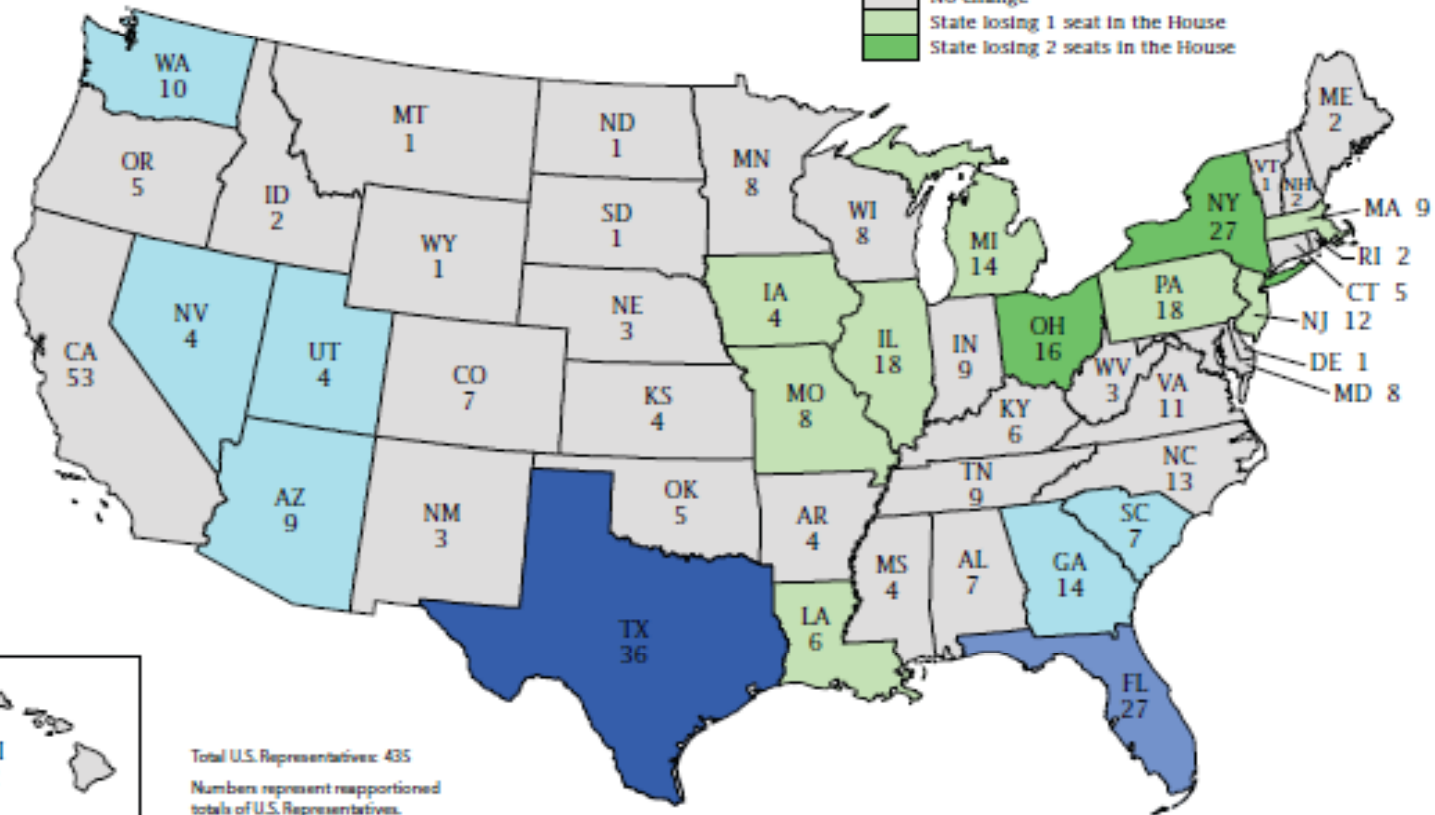


Apportionment of the U.S. House of Representatives Based on the 2010 Census

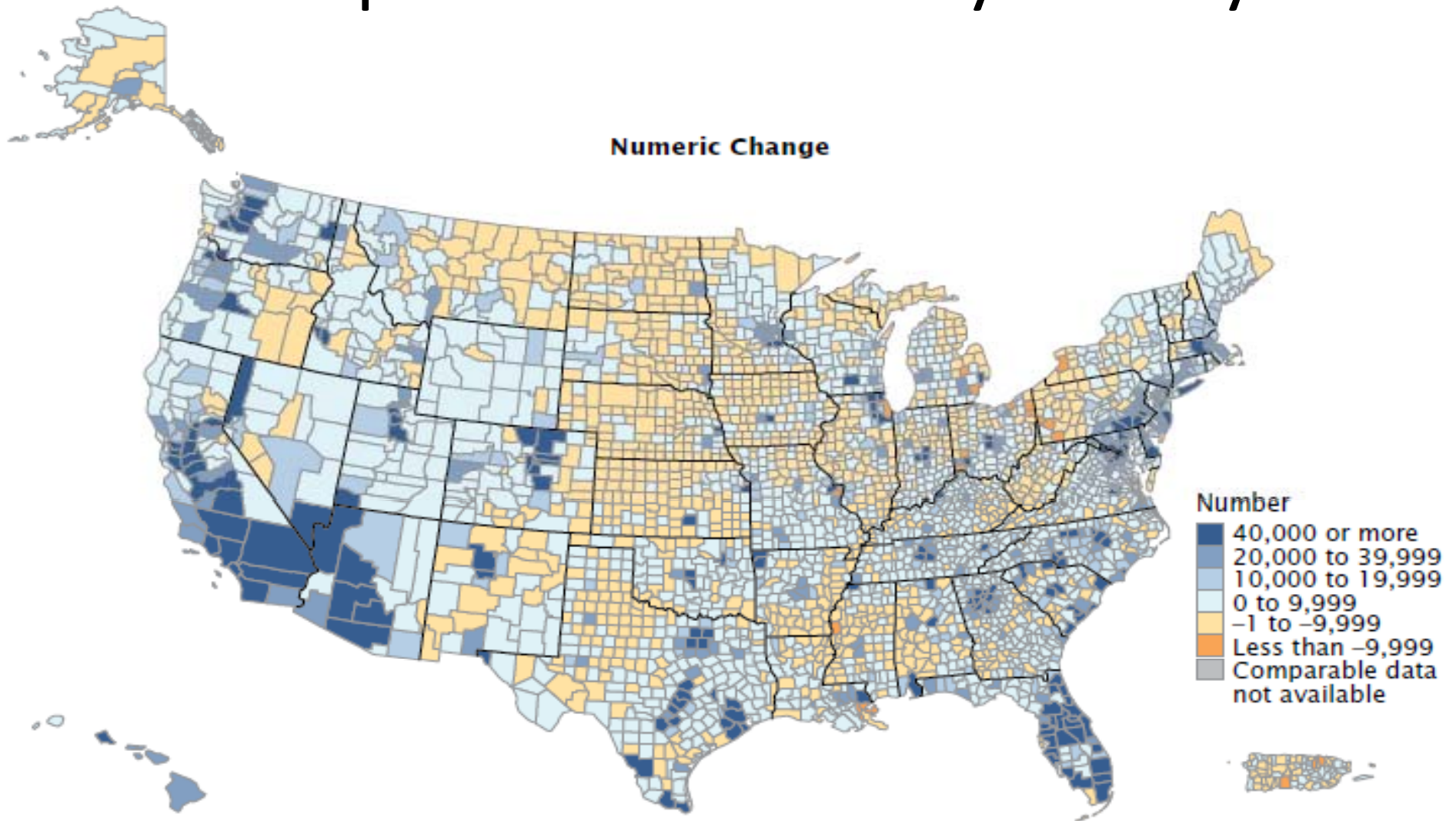

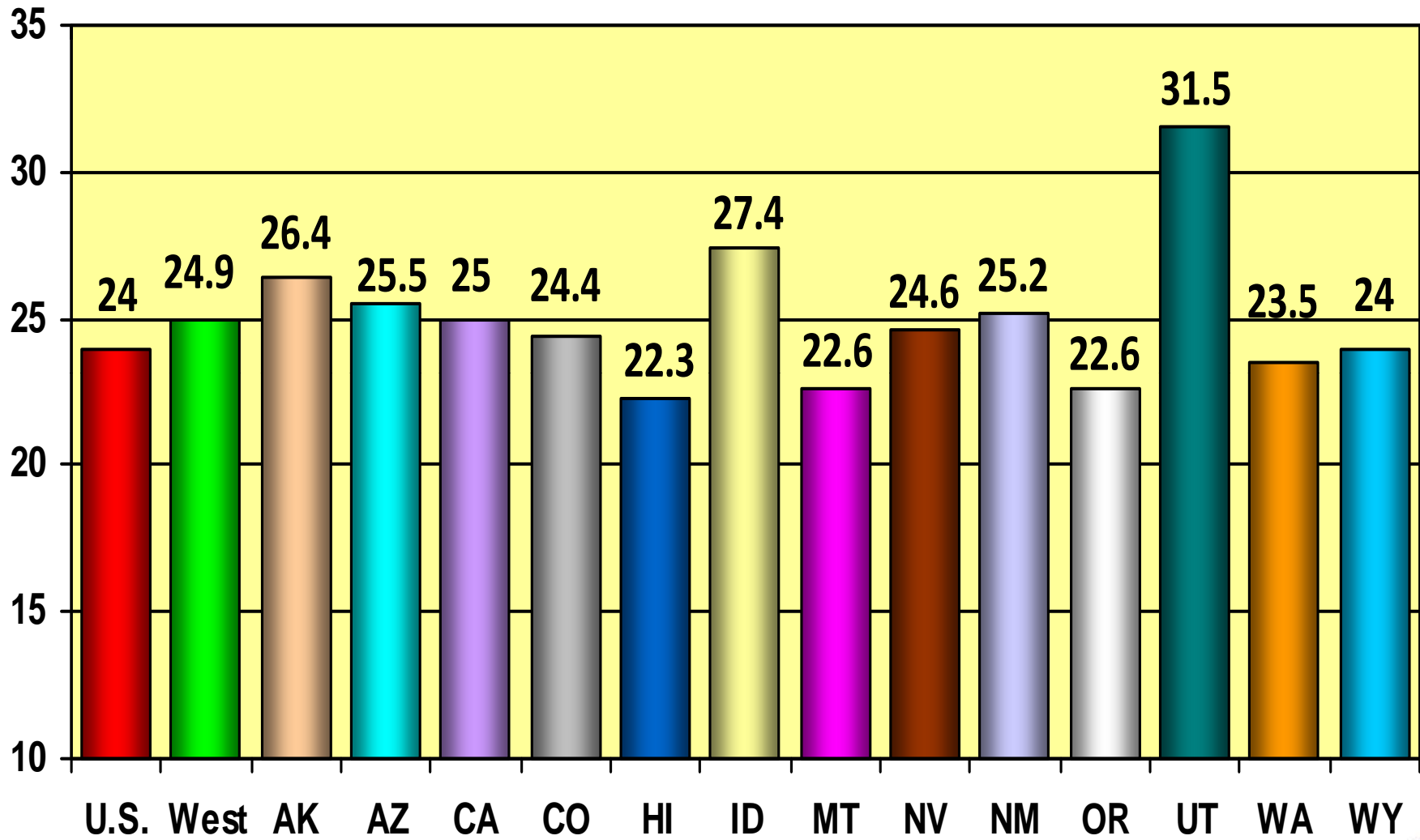
Median Age by State



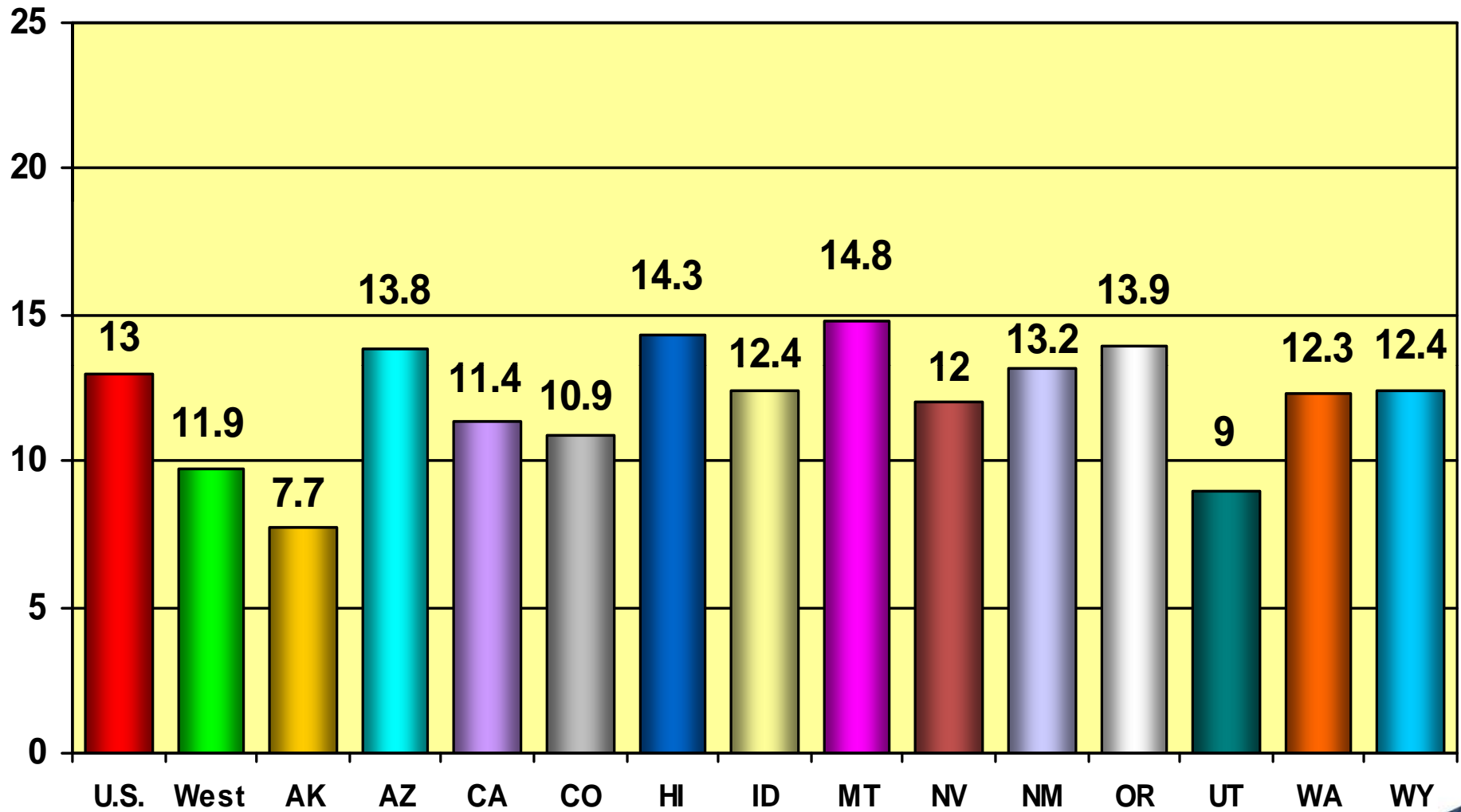

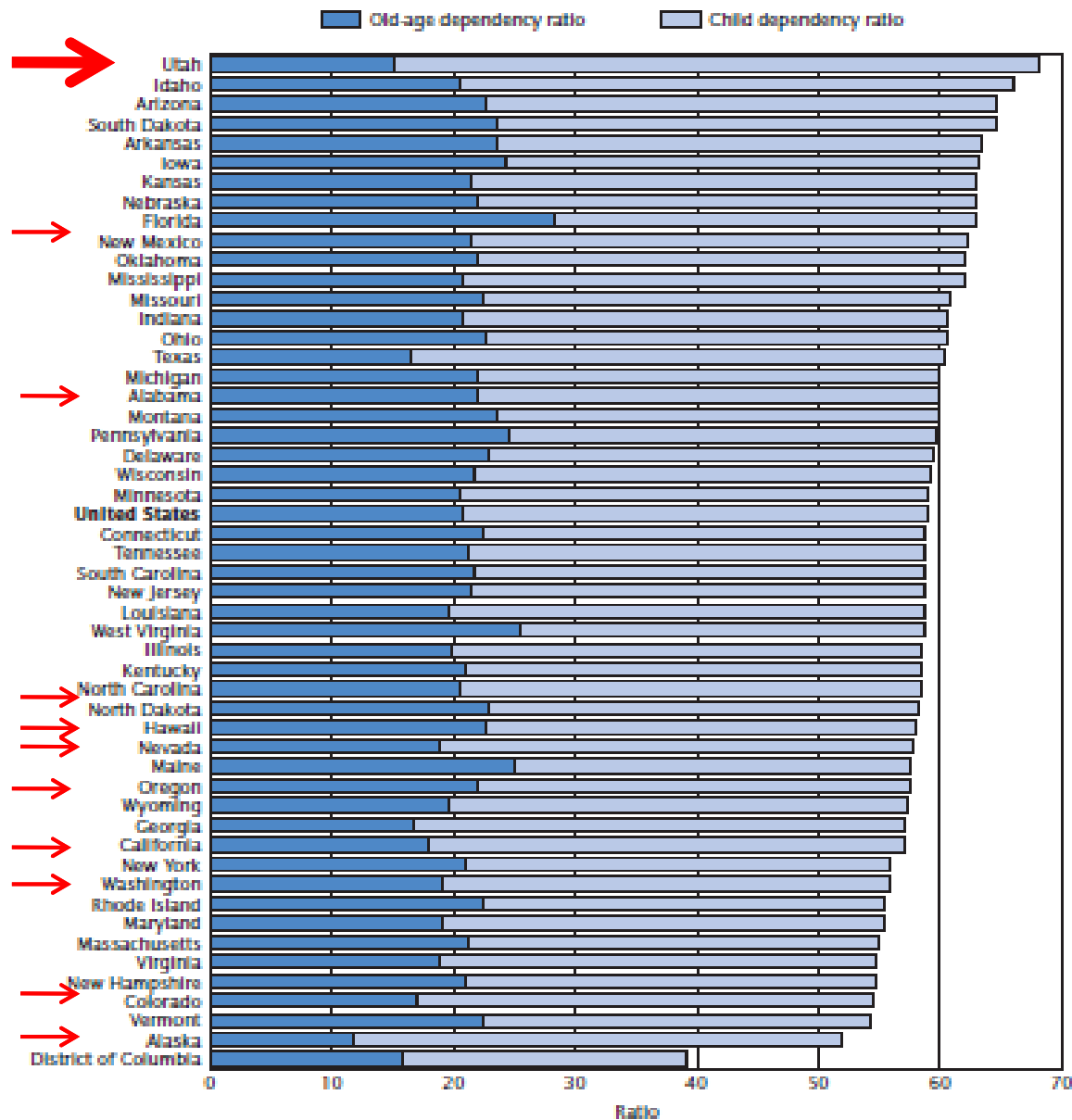


Percent Under Age 18 Population Western States



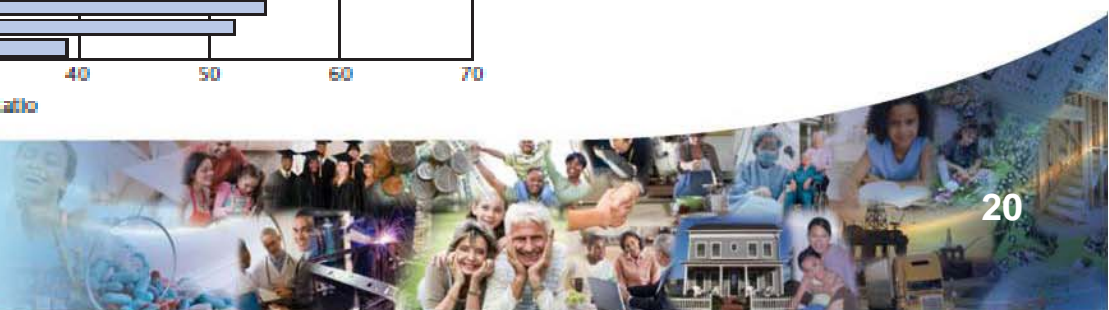

Total dependency ratio is the number of children (0-17) and older adults (ages 65 and over) per 100 people of working ages (ages 18-64) in the state.

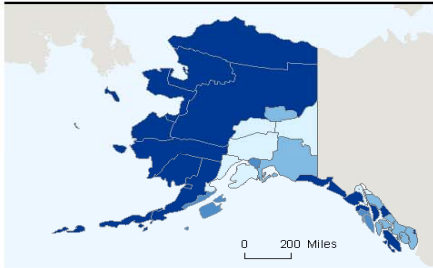

Total Minority Population

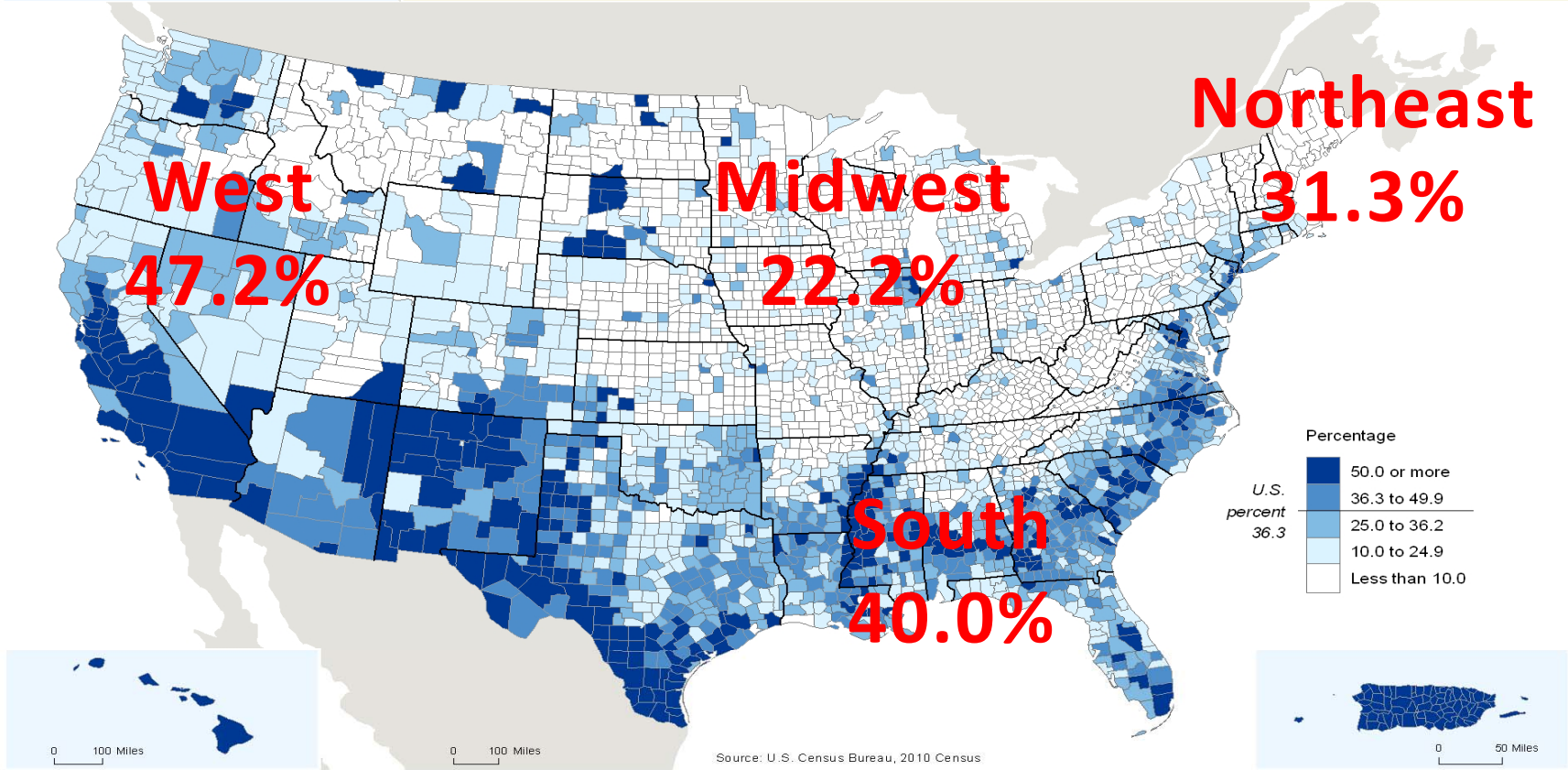
- The West contains the largest concentration of minorities in the Nation— nearly 34 million.

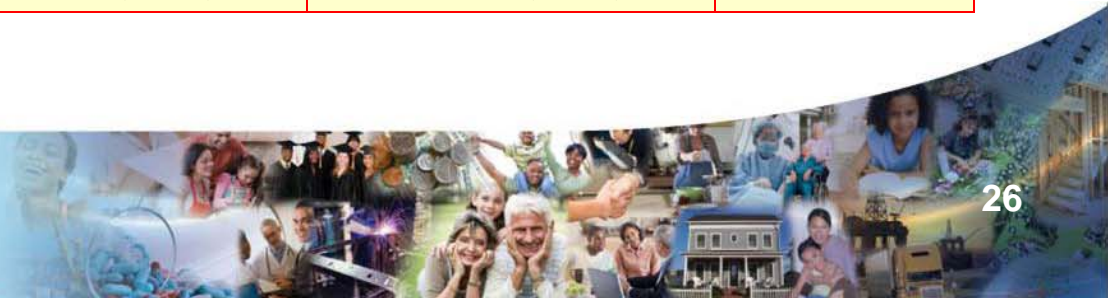


Diversity in the West

- 36% of all persons in the United States who are foreign born reside in the West.



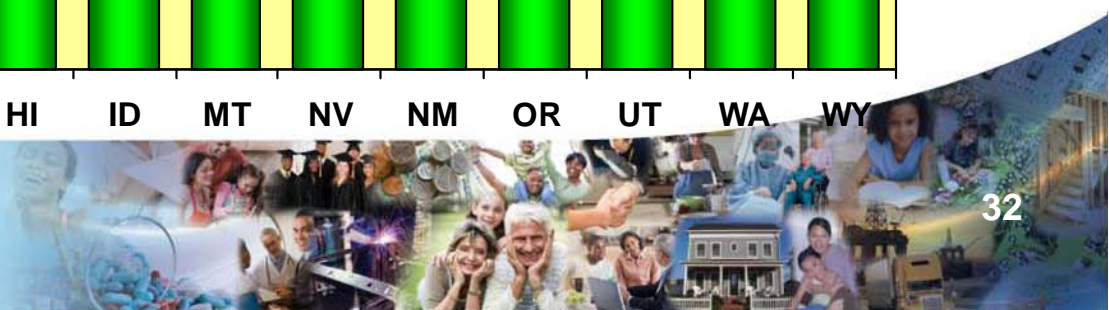
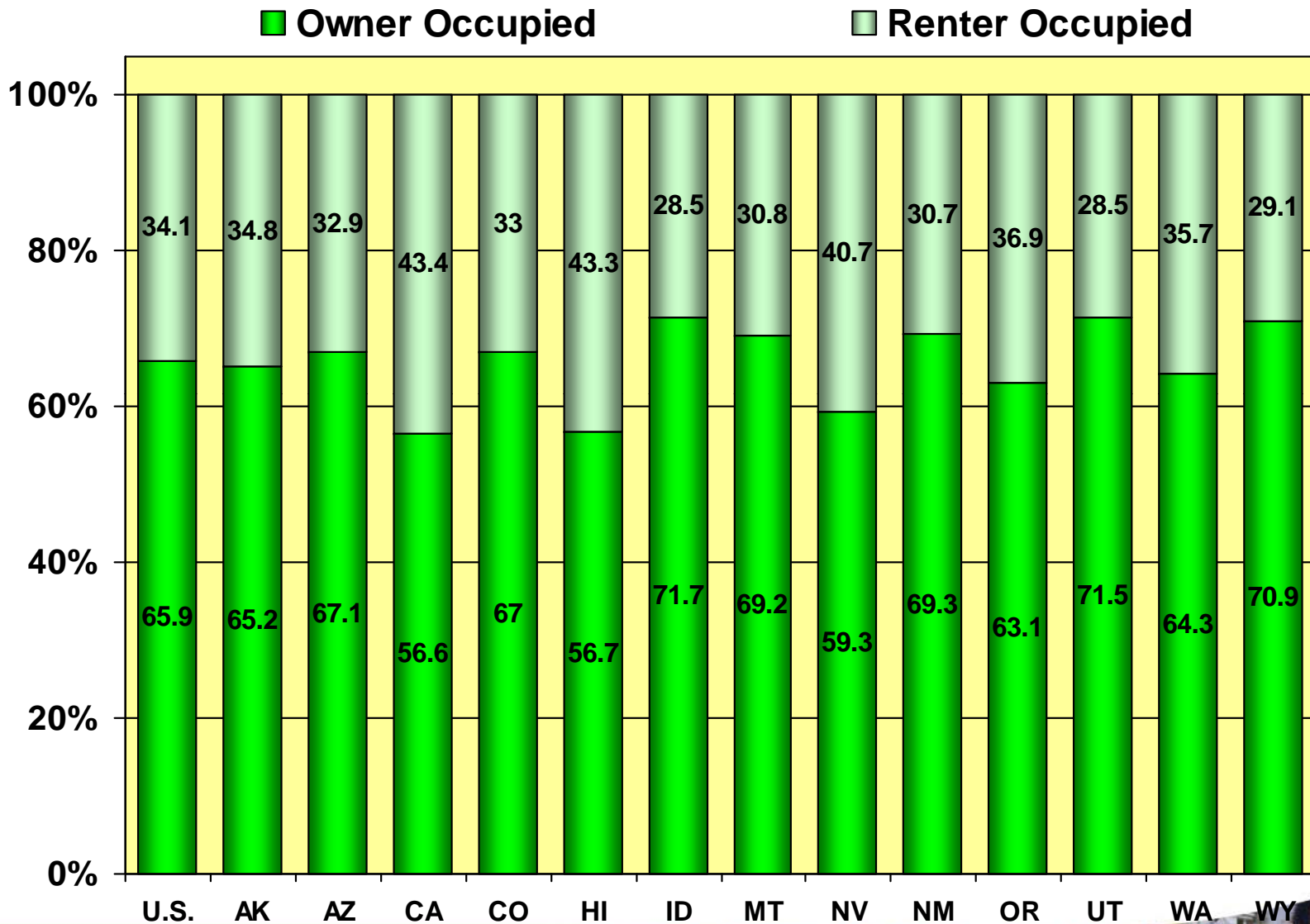

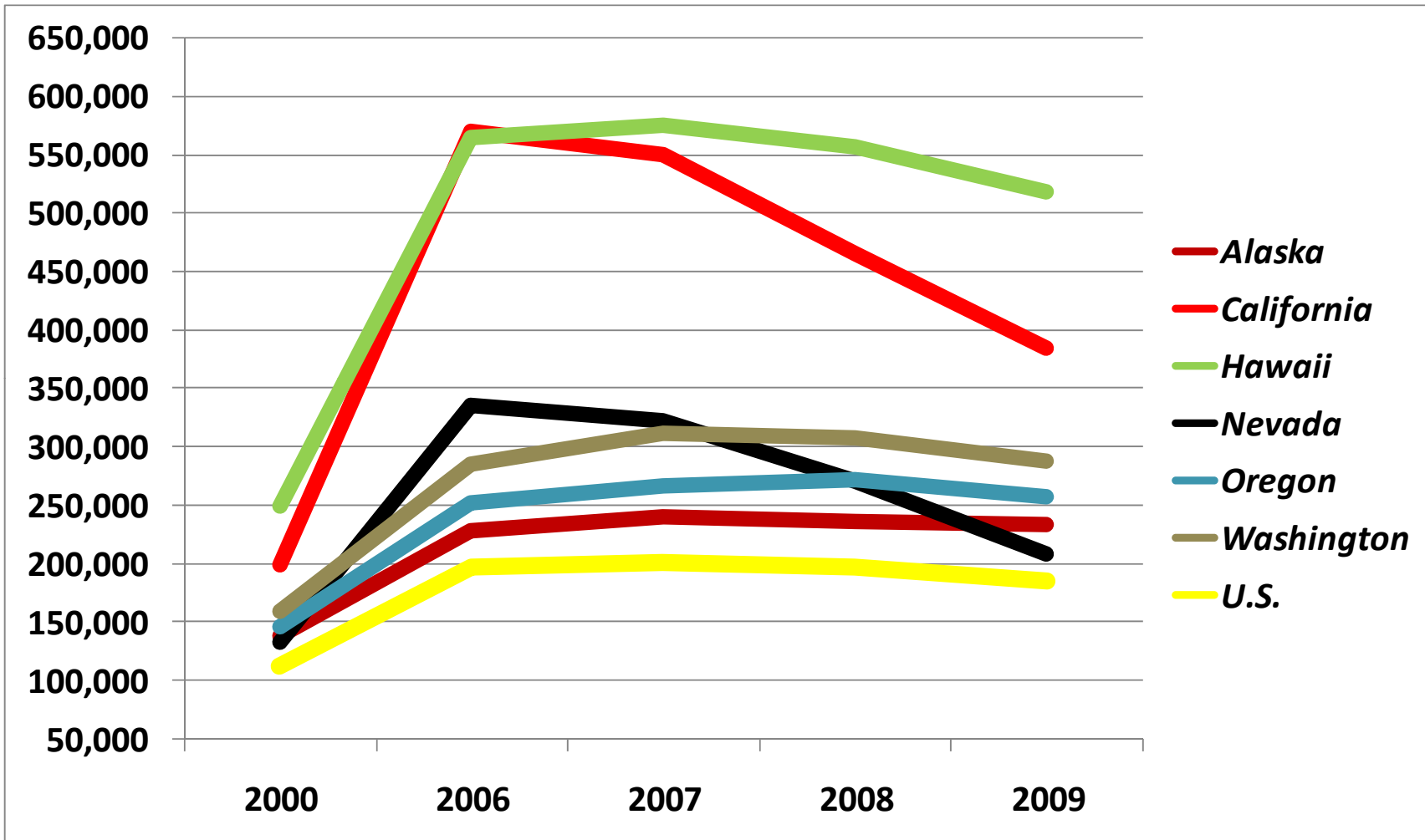

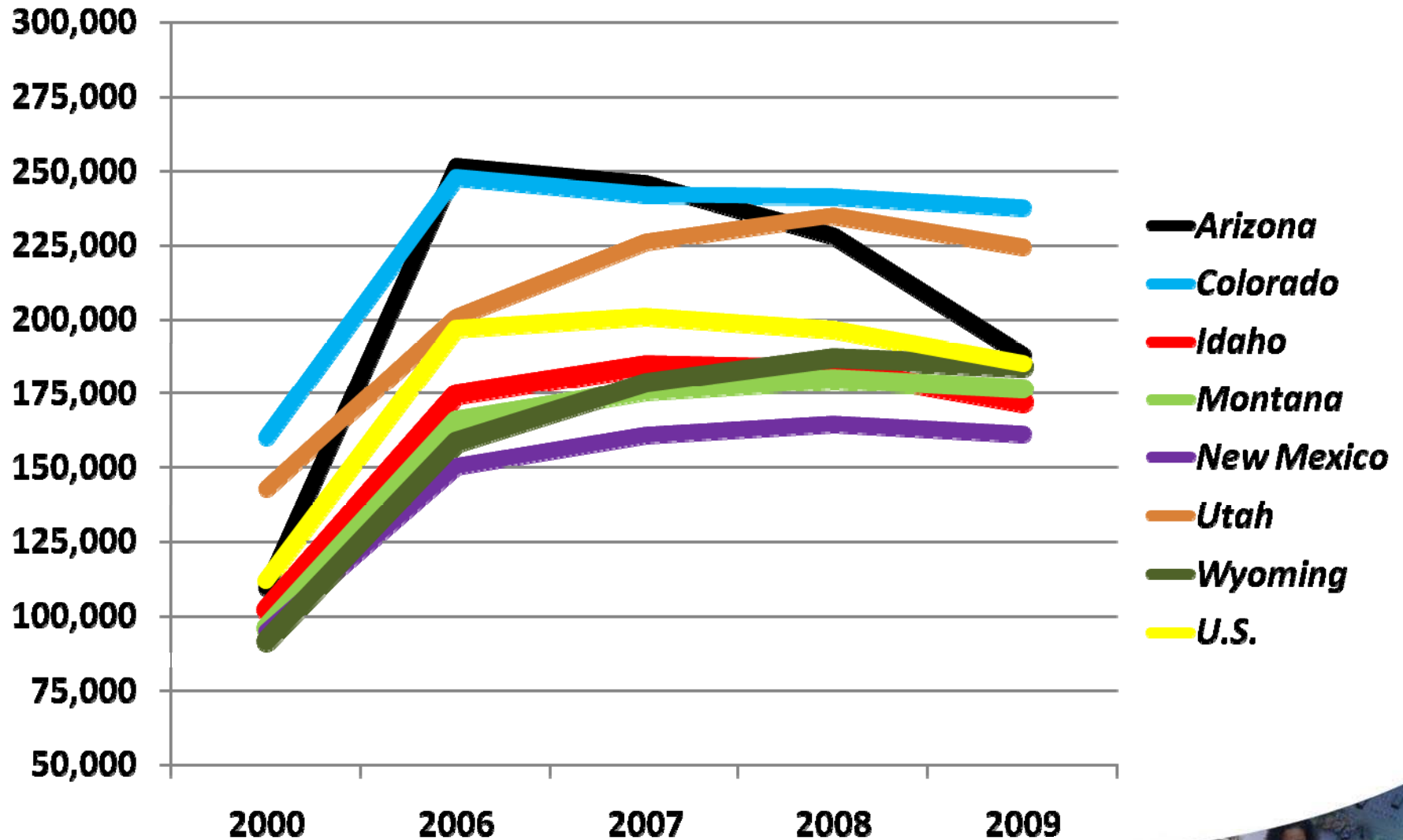

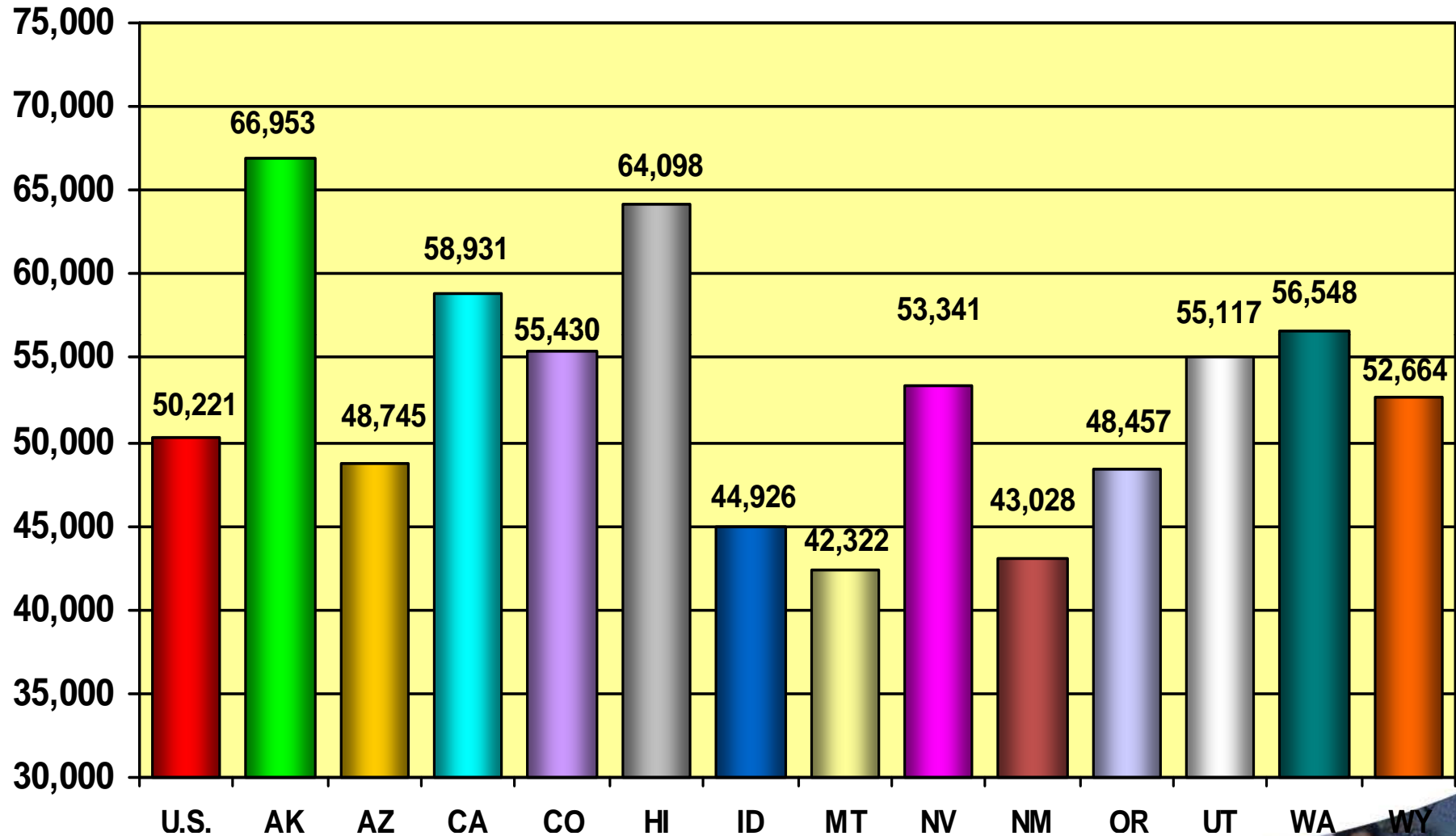
Median Value Owner-Occupied Housing Units

Federal Law: Title 13 Protections

- Private information never published
 - Names
 - Addresses (including GPS coordinates)
 - Telephone numbers
 - Social security numbers
- Information collected only to produce statistics
- Sworn for life to protect your confidentiality
 - Every person with access to your information
- Violating the law is a serious crime
 - Prison sentence up to 5 years
 - Fine of up to \$250,000



Privacy Principles

- Necessity
 - Do we need to ask this question?
 - Do we need to collect this information?
- Openness
 - Do you know why we are collecting this information?
- Respectful treatment of respondents
 - Are our efforts reasonable?
 - Did we treat you with respect?
- Confidentiality
 - How do we protect your information?



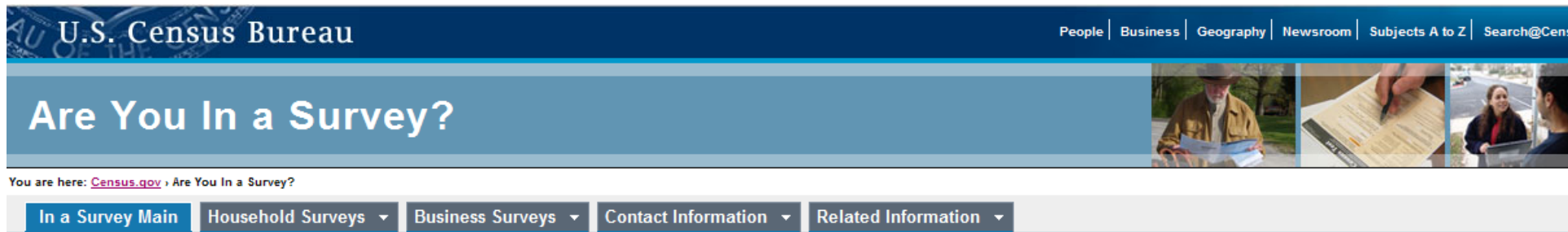
Statistical Safeguards

- Ensure that released statistics do not identify individuals or businesses
 - Extensive review and analysis of all data products
 - Disclosure avoidance methodologies
 - Screen out data that might identify specific individual or business
 - Employ data suppression or modification
 - Disclosure Review Board sets confidentiality rules for all data product releases

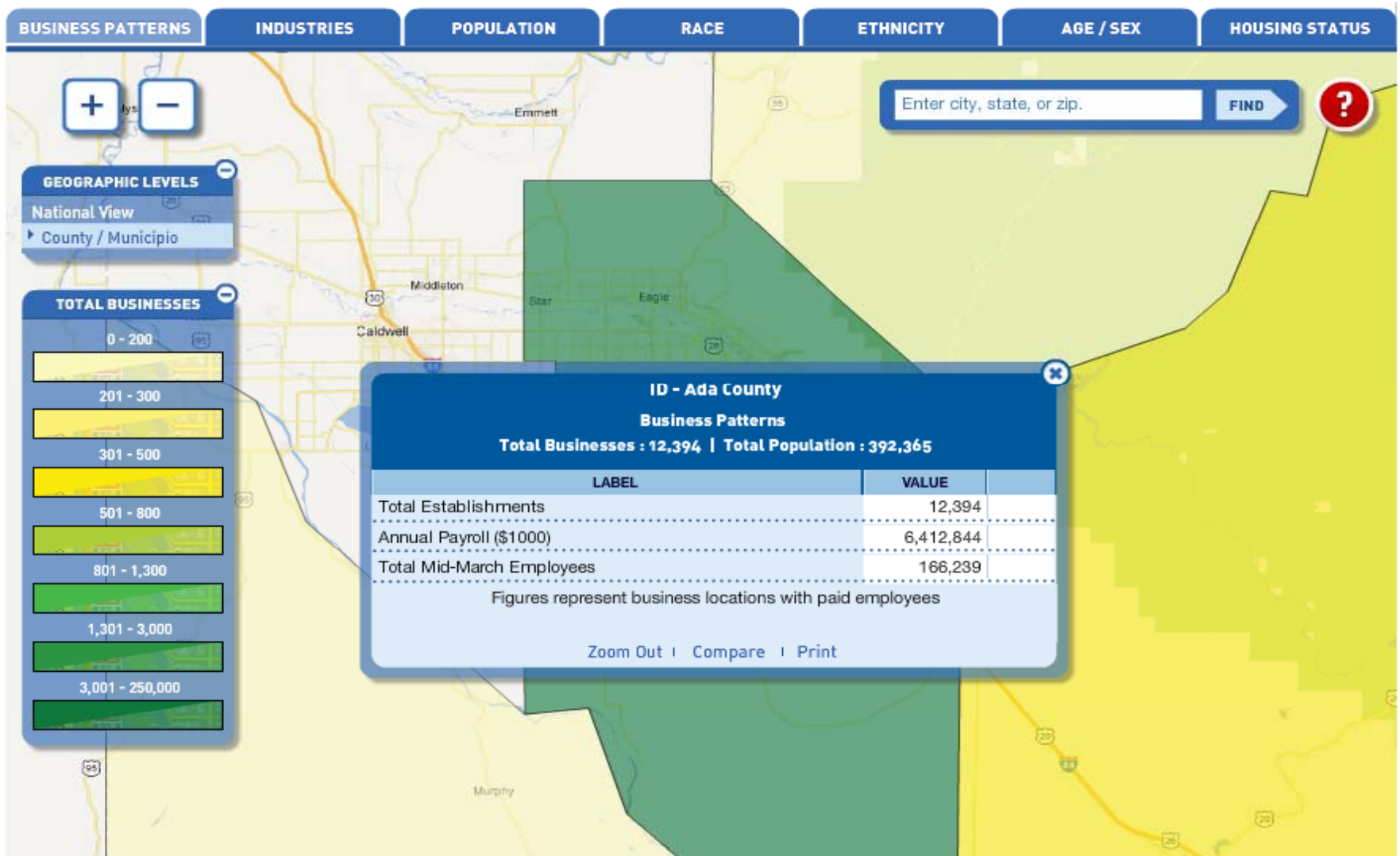
