After discussion, Karen Gallagher moved and Rhonda Jalbert seconded to recommend forwarding these rankings, including the CIM Implementation Grant rankings of 2 projects, with the exception of spending TMA dollars outside of the boundary for the Kuna project for COMPASS Board approval.

After discussion, Patricia Nilsson moved and Jeff Lowe seconded a substitute motion to recommend the priorities, including the CIM priorities as listed on Attachment 3, for COMPASS Board approval. And request that the COMPASS Board form a workgroup of RTAC to develop a comprehensive funding policy relative to the planning area, the TMA, and STP urban geographies, as well as the funds as identified in *Communities in Motion*. Motion passed 16 to 10.

# D. Recommend Amendment to the FY2016-2020 Regional Transportation Improvement Program

Toni Tisdale presented an amendment to the FY2016-2020 TIP, as requested by ITD and Western Federal Lands. The amendments will allow projects to proceed for obligation of funding.

After discussion, Patricia Nilsson moved and Nichoel Baird Spencer seconded approval of the FY2016-2020 TIP amendment as detailed by Toni Tisdale for COMPASS Board approval. Motion passed unanimously.

#### INFORMATION/DISCUSSION ITEMS

## A. Discuss SHRP 2 Projects

Liisa Itkonen provided a status report on the \$225,000 SHRP 2 technical assistance grant COMPASS received in two categories: freight considerations and performance measure and the work done to date. The work will be completed by December 2016.

# B. Discuss Federal MAP-21 Rulemaking

Carl Miller provided a status report on federal MAP-21 rulemaking and reviewed the rulemaking schedule and next steps.

# C. Discuss STP-TMA Funding Policy for CIM 2040 2.0

The committee continued discussion on the policy of focusing federal Surface Transportation Program (STP) funds on maintenance with a presentation on Canyon Highway District #4's maintenance needs. Other agencies will present maintenance needs for discussion and background for a CIM 2040 2.0 funding policy at the February 2016 RTAC meeting.
