# A. Approve January 23, 2019, RTAC Meeting Minutes

Nichoel Baird Spencer moved and Patricia Nilsson seconded approval of the Consent Agenda as presented.

# **ACTION ITEMS**

#### A. Review and Recommend Support of Idaho Transportation Department's Draft Statewide 2040 Long-Range Transportation Plan

Ken Kanownik and Margaret Havey, ITD staff, presented a review of the Idaho Transportation Department's draft statewide 2040 long-range transportation plan.

After discussion, **Clair Bowman moved and Nichoel Baird-Spencer seconded to continue any action on the Idaho Transportation Department's draft statewide 2040 long-range transportation plan to the March 13, 2019, RTAC meeting to allow time for further review. Motion passed unanimously.** 

# B. Recommend Federal-Aid Project Ranking

Toni Tisdale reviewed the ranking of Federal-Aid project applications for five Surface Transportation Project-Transportation management Area (STP-TMA) projects, three Transportation Alternatives Program-TAP (TAP-TMA) projects, and nine STP-Urban Program projects. Using the ranking information, the projects will be matched with available funding, starting with the highest ranked projects. Funding recommendations will be shared via email and provided for discussion at an optional March 6, 2019, RTAC workshop and for action in the March 13, 2019, regular RTAC meeting. After discussion, **Patricia Nilsson moved and Clair Bowman seconded to forward the** recommendations as presented, but under the STP-Urban Program break the tie between the City of Caldwell's project: Pedestrian Pathway – Ustick Road to Homedale Road and the City of Nampa's project: Stoddard City Pathway (Sherman to 2<sup>nd</sup> Street South) by prioritizing the Caldwell project above the Nampa project. Motion passed unanimously.

#### A. Review Transit Performance Measure Policy and Annual Report of Transit Performance Measures

Brian Parker, Valley Regional Transit, provided a draft copy of Valley Regional Transit's Regional Performance Measurement Policy in the packet and reviewed the Annual Report of Transit Performance Measures.

# B. Receive Safety Targets

Carl Miller reviewed the annual update of federally required safety targets adopted by the Idaho Transportation Department and federally required for metropolitan planning organizations. In November 2017, the COMPASS Board approved supporting the statewide targets established by the Idaho Transportation Department.
