CALL TO ORDER:

Chair Nichoel Baird Spencer called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

OPEN DISCUSSION/ANNOUNCEMENTS

General announcements were made.

CONSENT AGENDA

A. Approve March 21, 2018 RTAC Meeting Minutes

Nathan Leigh moved and Caleb Hood seconded approval of the Consent Agenda as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

SPECIAL ITEM

A. Presentation on Electric Vehicle Charging Stations

Patti Best from Idaho Power presented an overview of trends in the use of electric vehicles and corresponding needs and requirements for charging stations.

ACTION ITEM

A. Approve Transportation Management Area Balancing Actions

Toni Tisdale presented actions to balance the Surface Transportation Program – Transportation Management Area (STP-TMA) and Transportation Alternatives Program - Management Area (TAP-TMA): releasing funds as requested from Ada County Highway District and Valley Regional Transit; and increasing federal-aid funding as requested by Ada County Highway District, City of Boise, City of Eagle, and Boise State University.

After discussion, Justin Lucas moved and Randall Falkner seconded recommending COMPASS Board approval of the balancing actions in the FY2018-2022 Regional Transportation Improvement Program as presented. And that COMPASS staff contact ITD and officially request that the increase of the appropriation amount be distributed through the state by formula and clarify the need within the TMA in the Boise urbanized area. Motion passed unanimously.

Toni noted that actions taken in the FY2018-2022 TMA-TAP program impacts the FY2019-2023 TIP and requested approval of adjustments to the FY2019-2023 TMA-TAP program.

After discussion, Patricia Nilsson moved and Rhonda Jalbert seconded approval of the balancing adjustments of the FY2019-2023 TMA-TAP program as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

INFORMATION/DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. Discuss Pavement, Bridge, and System Performance Federal Performance Measure Targets

Carl Miller discussed the pavement, bridge, and system performance federal performance measure targets and what the penalties would be for missing deadlines. Carl introduced ITD staff members Chapman Munn and David Coladner who provided an overview of the process and methodology used in meeting the Idaho Transportation Department statewide targets.

After discussion, it was agreed to have the COMPASS Performance Measure Framework Workgroup make a recommendation to RTAC regarding setting local targets.

B. Review Reporting of Federal Performance Measure Targets in the Regional Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Toni Tisdale provided an update on reporting deadlines for eight federal performance measure targets in the TIP.
