CALL TO ORDER:

Chair Nichoel Baird Spencer called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

CONSENT AGENDA

A. Approve May 2 and May 23, 2018, RTAC Meeting Minutes

Clair Bowman moved and Jeff Barnes seconded approval of the Consent Agenda as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

ACTION ITEMS

A. Recommend Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) Targets

Carl Miller presented the FHWA MAP-21 pavement, bridge, and system performance targets as recommended by the Performance Measure Framework Workgroup.

After discussion, Justin Lucas moved and Wendy Howell seconded to recommend COMPASS Board of Directors' adoption of the pavement, bridge, and system performance targets to support the statewide targets. Motion passed unanimously.

B. Approve Transportation Management Area Balancing

Toni Tisdale requested approval to balance the Surface Transportation Program-Transportation Management Area (STP-TMA) program based on Ada County Highway District's request to move \$13,000 from the Five Mile Road/Fairview Avenue project to cover higher than anticipated costs for a project on State Highway 16 and Beacon Light Road.

After discussion, Justin Lucas moved and Wendy Howell seconded approval of the STP-TMA balancing action for the FY2018-2022 Regional Transportation Improvement Program as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

C. Recommend FY2019 Communities in Motion (CIM) Implementation Grants and Project Development Program Projects

Kathy Parker presented FY2019 CIM Implementation Grants and Project Development Program projects for COMPASS Board of Directors' approval. Kathy noted a revision to the Project Development Program list moving the City of Eagle's grade separated bike/ped crossing of SH-44 project ranking from No. 3 to No. 2 and the City of Nampa's downtown Nampa Wall Street alley pedestrian connectivity project ranking from No. 2 to No. 3.

After discussion, Clair Bowman moved and Gordon Bates seconded to recommend COMPASS Board of Directors' approval of the FY2019 CIM Implementation Grants and Project Development Program projects as revised. Motion passed unanimously.

D. Recommend Change to Draft FY2019-2023 Regional Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Toni Tisdale presented a request from the City of Nampa to remove Grimes Pathway in the Draft FY2019-2023 Regional TIP and replace it with a roadway configuration project at Holly Street and Northwest Nazarene University, the next project on the prioritized list.

After discussion, Clair Bowman moved and Tom Ferch seconded to remove the Grimes Pathway project (STP-U funds) from the Draft FY2019-2023 TIP and replace it with the Holly Street/Northwest Nazarene University reconfiguration project as presented. Motion passed unanimously.
