CALL TO ORDER

Vice Chair Howell called the meeting to order at 9:03 a.m.

#### AGENDA ADDITIONS/CHANGES

None.

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#### **OPEN DISCUSSION/ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Jon Cecil said Idaho Smart Growth will host an Open House on November 4, 2010, 5:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m., at the Empire Building on 10<sup>th</sup> and Idaho in Boise: "Local Motion: Everybody Moves" and the Idaho Transportation Department will host an Open House Public Meeting on November 15, 2010, 4:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m., at the BSU Student Union, Farnsworth Room, on the new strategic long-range plan.

Toni Tisdale said the Idaho Transportation Department (ITD) has state money that will go into the FY2013 STIP for small projects within District 3: \$500,000 total (\$200,000 already spoken for by ACHD). Toni commented that Michael Garz will offer more detail later in the meeting.

Mary Barker said Valley Regional Transit, in conjunction with Capital City Development Corporation, is replacing the shelters and the main transit stations in downtown Boise.

Don Matson said at RTAC's September 2010 meeting, motions were made on a couple of items. It was brought to staff's attention, that according to the RTAC Bylaws, the number of votes per member agency parallels to the votes on the COMPASS Board (i.e., the City of Meridian has two votes, City of Nampa has two votes, etc.). In the future, if there is a split vote, a roll call vote will be taken.

Don introduced Lori Porreca of the Federal Highway Administration.

Introductions were made of all attendees.

#### CONSENT AGENDA

- B. Approve September 16, 2010 Special Meeting Minutes

Jon Cecil moved and Sabrina Anderson seconded to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

#### ACTION ITEMS

A. Election of Officers

Sabrina Anderson nominated Wendy Howell to serve as RTAC's Chair. There being no other nominations, the nominations were closed. By unanimous consent, Wendy Howell was elected to serve as RTAC's Chair for the remainder of 2010 and 2011.

Kathleen Lacey nominated Sabrina Anderson to serve as RTAC's Vice Chair, Sabrina Anderson nominated Caleb Hood to serve as RTAC's Vice Chair, and Caleb Hood nominated Kathleen Lacey to serve as RTAC's Vice Chair. There being no other nominations, the nominations were closed.

Chair Howell called roll. The following RTAC member agencies voted for Sabrina Anderson: Ada County, Association of Canyon County Highway Districts, City of Caldwell, and City of Meridian with a total of 10 votes.

The following RTAC member agencies voted for Caleb Hood: Ada County Highway District, Capital City Development Corp., City of Boise, City of Middleton, Department of Environmental Quality, and Valley Regional Transit with a total of 10 votes. Boise State University cast its vote for Kathleen Lacey.

Chair Howell announced there was a tie in the election of Vice Chair. Boise State University changed its vote to Caleb Hood and broke the tie. With all votes counted, Caleb Hood was elected to serve as RTAC's Vice Chair for the remainder of 2010 and 2011.

# Information/Discussion Items

# A. Review Transportation Financial Data Report

Nathan Dale presented the Revenue and Expenditure Report.

Mary Barker commented that the transit section is out of date and inaccurate. Nathan responded the National Transit Database reports did not have 2009 data.

Charles Trainor said that COMPASS was written up last year for not having a financially constrained plan. COMPASS staff is working with ITD and asking them to work with staff and other metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) to give some kind of ballpark estimate as to what we could expect - not a budget or commitment - for roadway expansion. The state doesn't put any dollars into transit, it is all federal money. This report will help us get on a more uniform playing field with the other MPOs regarding inflation, how to know the state roadway system is being addressed in terms of maintenance and safety, etc. We are modeling our approach on Utah's: here's what is being spent for operations, maintenance, and safety and with the remaining dollars, here's the planning target for expansion in your metropolitan area.

Nathan said he would like to make some improvements over the course of the year and requested feedback on how to report on maintaining the road system and how to show the public what we need to expand the system.

## Discussion:

- If we don't do the preventative maintenance, what happens when we need a full rebuild? If we don't invest now, where will we be in ten years? Make sure we are capturing all the capital maintenance.
- Who is the audience? Show actual pictures of potholing, levels of services, etc. Need to provide visuals.
- The public may not understand the terminology. We need to define those terms (revenue miles, trips per capita, etc.).

## B. Discuss Idaho Transportation Department (ITD) Draft Long-Range Plan Idaho on the Move

Tyler Zundel, Project Manager presented ITD's *IDAHO ON THE MOVE:* A Long-Range Plan to Improve Safety Mobility and Economic Vitality.

#### Discussion:

- It would be helpful to know what ITD determines as a complete transportation system.
- Livability is important and there should be the encouragement of sidewalks and state projects.
- No reference is made to Urban issues.

# C. Update on RTAC Subcommittee regarding Protocol and Funding for US 20/26 and SH 44

Toni Tisdale reviewed recommendations for funding right-of-way on US 20/26 and SH 44 made by RTAC Subcommittee.

Toni said the Subcommittee will meet again on November 8, 2010 to discuss the Draft TIP Protocol and staff will request a recommendation to approve the Protocol. The subcommittee's recommendation will be presented to RTAC at the November 2010 meeting.

# D. Discuss Committee Workshops

Don Matson said special workshops are scheduled for the COMPASS Board. Don requested feedback regarding workshop topics that RTAC members would be interested in attending.

The following workshop topics were suggested:

Forecasting/Trends - how are they done? 2010 Census data Growth scenarios Complete streets High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) lanes Park and ride Successful Transit Oriented Developments (TODs) Brownfields (including relationship to grants) High capacity intersection treatments Innovative access management treatments Follow-up on modeling with/wo funding on state system Land use/transportation BSU-statewide land use planning study Roundabouts, esp peds, transit Grant-writing strategies, follow-up on recent applications Federal standards, views on sustainability

Members requested these workshops be open for other members of their staff to attend.

Sabrina Anderson asked when the modeling strategies will be presented to RTAC. Charles said he would check and forward that information.
